# Oregon's Drug Review: Evidence on Estrogen

Estrogen tablets, patches, or vaginal rings relieve signs of menopause. These include hot flashes, sleep problems, and mood changes. Vaginal estrogen treats vaginal dryness. Oral estrogen may be used with progesterone. Estrogen oral tablets and topical patches also prevent thinning of bone. Estrogen slightly increases risk for heart attacks and breast cancer.

## What Do These Drugs Have In Common?

- Oral and patch forms of estrogens relieve signs of menopause effectively.
- Oral and patch forms of estrogen improve bone density.
- Serious side effects may occur when estrogen is used for more than 5 years. Ask your doctor about the risks and benefits of estrogen for you.

#### What Are the Key Differences Among These Drugs?

- Some women obtain relief of vaginal dryness with vaginal forms of estrogen.
- Vaginal forms do not prevent osteoporosis.
