Clinger-Cohen Act

Enacted in 1996 Authority to award GWACs Reporting requirements and oversight responsibilities



What is a GWAC?

A Governmentwide Acquisition Contract is defined as a task or delivery order contract for information technology.

Contracts established by one agency for Governmentwide use Operated by an Executive Agency designated by the OMB Pursuant to Section 5112(e) of the Clinger-Cohen Act, 40 U.S.C 1412



GWAC Center Responsibilities

Provide:


Contract Management and Oversight Pre-award and Post-award Advice and assistance on GWAC task order scope and contract terms and conditions

Reporting to OMB and Contract Oversight

- Competition (number of offers received per task order)
- Award value
- Estimated value of task order for Period of Performance
- Socio-economic volume
- Exceptions to Fair Opportunity (FAR 16.505)
- Task order type
 - Fixed Price, Cost Reimbursement, Time and Material, Labor Hour
- Number of Task Orders Issued as Performance Based

Statutory authority
 5112(e) of the
 Clinger-Cohen Act,
 40 U.S.C. 1412(e)

Schedule 70

 Title III of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (41.U.S.C 251, et seq) and Title 40 U.S.C. 502, Services for Executive Agencies)

GSA GWACs

- Orders not protestable (except for scope, period of performance and maximum dollar of contract)
- Ombudsman process

Schedule 70

 Orders may be protested to the Contracting Officer or Government Accountability Office (GAO)

GSA GWACs

 Contracting Officers must be granted
 Delegation of
 Authority and
 receive training

Schedule 70

 Open for use by all warranted federal
 Contracting Officers
 and purchase card
 holders

GSA GWACs

 GSA GWACs are not authorized for use by state and local government entities under Section 211 of the E-Government Act of 2002

Schedule 70

 Section 211 of the E-Government Act allows for state and local government entitles to purchase from GSA Schedule 70, Information Technology

GSA GWACs

- Pre-qualified pool of contractors
- Ordering official does not have to perform further market research to narrow the field

Schedule 70

 Ordering official researches the pool of contractors to find contractors capable of performing the specific requirement



GSA GWACs

GSA establishes
 labor categories

Schedule 70

 Company proposes their established labor categories

GSA GWACs

 Base contract period with options for extension not to exceed a preestablished number of years

Schedule 70

 One five-year basic contract period and three five-year option periods



GSA GWACs

• Solutions-Based

• Team Arrangements

GSA GWACs

 Fixed Price (all types), Cost Reimbursement, Time and Material, Labor Hour task orders (depending on contract)

Schedule 70

 Fixed Price (all types), Time and Material, and Labor Hour task orders

GSA GWACs

- Fixed period for receipt of proposals at contract level
- May provide for "onramp" at option periods if in best interest of the government

Schedule 70

• Standing solicitation

GSA GWACs

 Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs) not permitted

Schedule 70

 BPAs may be established in accordance with FAR 8.405-3

GSA GWACs

 Meets 803 requirements by providing fair opportunity to all contractors offering the required services under a multiple award contract

• DFARS 216.505-70

Schedule 70

 Requires receipt of three offers or the CO determines in writing that no additional contractors can fulfill the work requirement

• DFARS 208.404-70

HUBZone – Historically Underutilized Business Zones

Set aside for HUBZone certified firms HUBZone Act of 1997, Title VI of P.L. 105-135 created the HUBZone Empowerment Contracting Program

8(a) STARS - Streamlined Technology Acquisition Resources for Services

Competitive 8(a) contract

Section 8(a) of the Small Business Act (P.L. 85-536) & FAR Part 19

New! VETS – Veterans Technology Services

Set aside for service-disabled veteran-owned firms Executive Order 13360

New! VETS GWAC

Multiple award indefinite-delivery, indefinite-quantity contract for information technology solutions Five-year base with a five-year option Allows fixed price, time and materials, and labor hour task orders \$5 billion program ceiling

Two Functional Areas (FAs):

FA 1 Systems Operations and Maintenance

FA 2 Information Systems Engineering

*Both functional areas include IT Security Services



VETS GWAC Customer Benefits


Provides a pool of highly-qualified, service-disabled veteran-owned firms to compete for agency requirements

Awards include over 40 Service Disabled Veterans as well as other small business partners

Subcontracting provisions of the Veterans Act

Offers streamlined ordering procedures

Enables Federal agencies to exceed the 3% servicedisabled veteran-owned socioeconomic contracting goals

- 29 Industry Partners
- Contract period 2003-2008
- Fair opportunity must be provided unless exception applies

8(a) STARS

- 409 Industry Partners
- Contract period 2004-2011
- Directed orders allowed up to \$3.5 million
- Fair opportunity must be used in orders in excess of \$3.5 million

VETS

- 43 Industry Partners
- Awarded
 December 2006
- Expires 2017
- Fair Opportunity must be provided unless exception applies

Small Business GWACs

HUBZone

- 4 Functional Areas
- 7 to 9 contract awards in each FA
- 8 firms with task orders worth \$30.6 million
- Top 3 customers: DOJ, Navy, EPA

8(a) STARS

- 8 Functional Areas
- Multiple contract awards in each FA
- 234 firms with task orders worth
 \$716.8 million
- Top 3 customers:
 DoD, Army, Air
 Force

VETS

- 2 Functional Areas
- Multiple awards in each FA



Enterprise GWAC Center West

ANSWER

- Program Manager and Group Manager
- ➤ 7 geographical rate areas
- 147 labor categories
- 40 hours of ongoing training per full time equivalent
- Contractor required to meet minimum educational and experience requirements

Millennia

- Corporate Officer will be the overall manager of the contract
- One geographical rate nationwide
- 17 labor categories
- Contractor shall provide fully trained personnel for task orders
- IAW with FAR 39.104 minimum education & experience requirements will not be specified

Maintains state-of-the-art technology refreshment through onramp and off-ramp provisions




