

COST

ISSUES

- The 'System' (administrative cost, cost-shift, reimbursement constraints, 'defensive medicine')
- Services (drugs, technology)
- Changes in populations (aging, chronic conditions)

- Control drug costs/advertising
- Regulate insurer rate increases
- Tort reform
- Fund/reimburse prevention and health education

Access

ISSUES

- Workforce shortages
- Barriers to access (geographic, transportation, uninsurance, language, culture, immigration status)

- Broaden scopes of practice
- Improve reimbursement
- Provide incentives for providers to practice in rural areas



ISSUES

 The 'System' (Accountability, inefficiencies, inconsistent definitions of quality, inadequate workforce to ensure quality)

- Public information about quality measures
- Communication tools technology and team
- Publicly available Information on cost
- Reduce administrative burdens
- Increase use of evidence-based practices

Health Status

ISSUES

- Education
- Nutrition
- Tobacco
- Individual responsibility

- Schools to provide physical education, health education
- Eliminate or regulate vending machines / fast food in schools
- Reimbursement for prevention/health education
