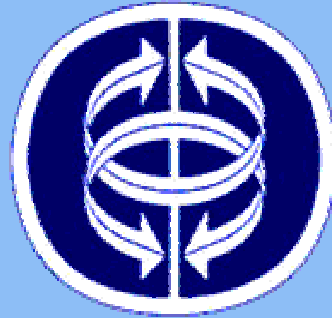

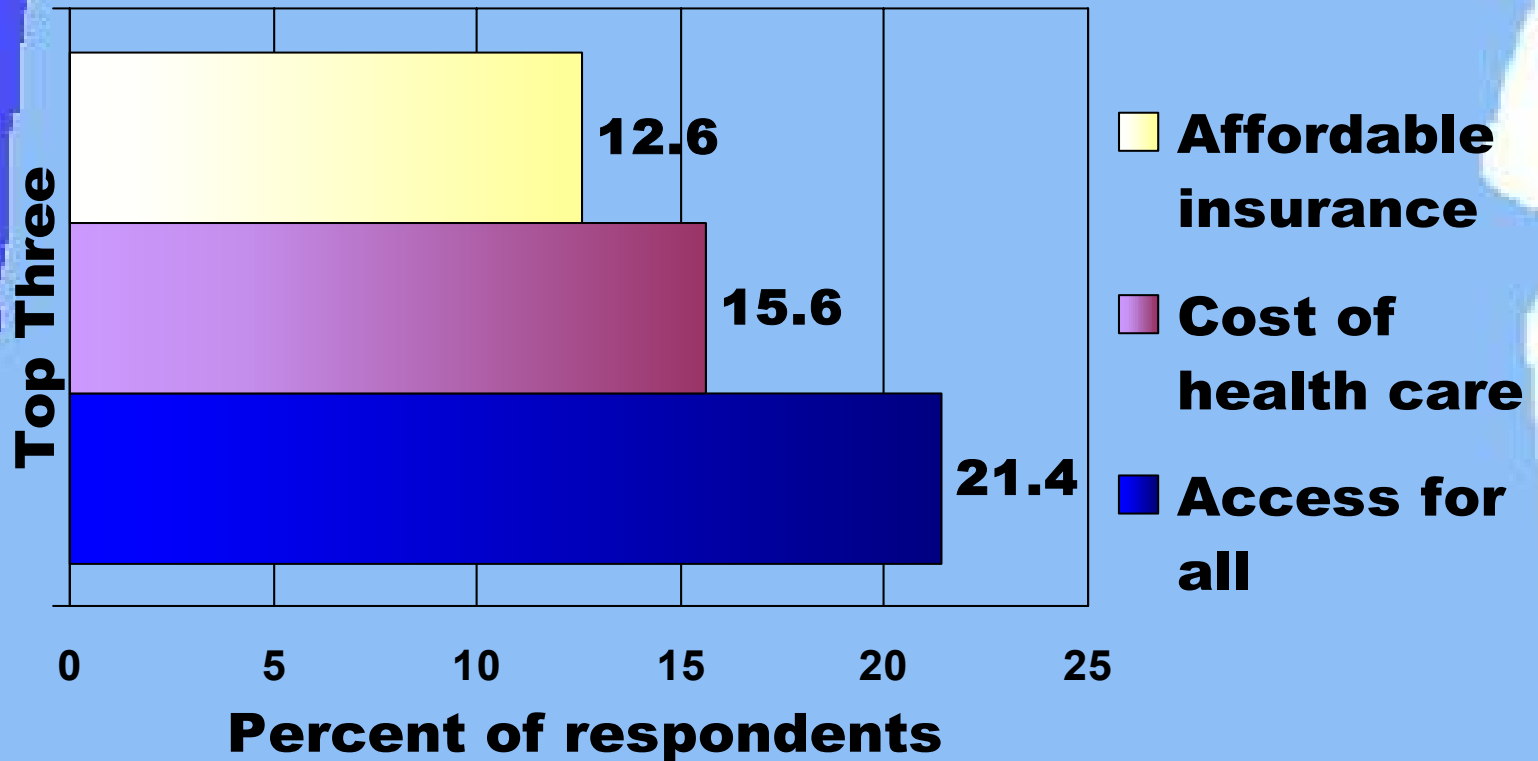

# Survey FAQs

- **What type of survey?**
  - **Computer-assisted telephone interview (randomly dialed)**
- **How many people?**
  - **531**
- **Is that enough people?**
  - **Representative sample of the entire state**
  - **Margin of error:  $\pm 4.25\%$**

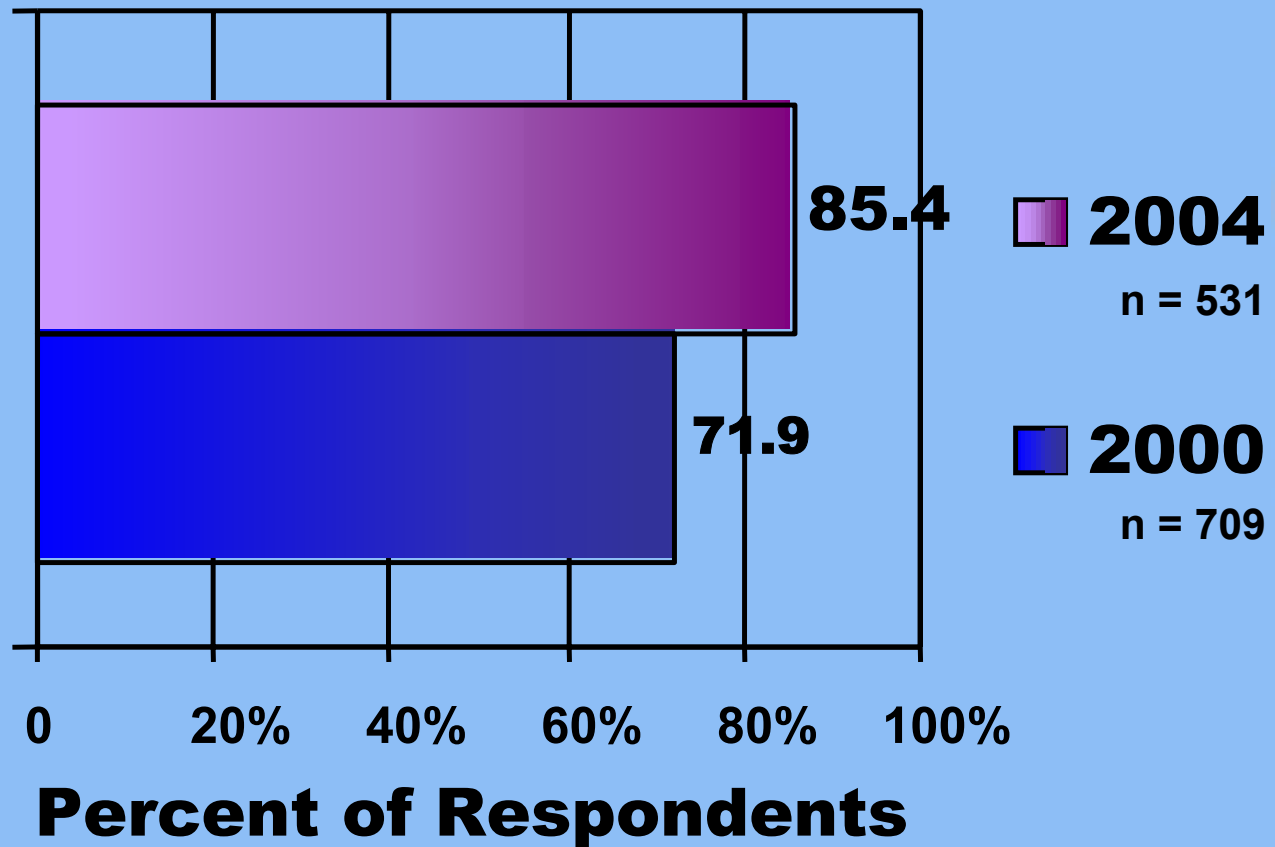


# What do you think is the #1 problem in Oregon health care?

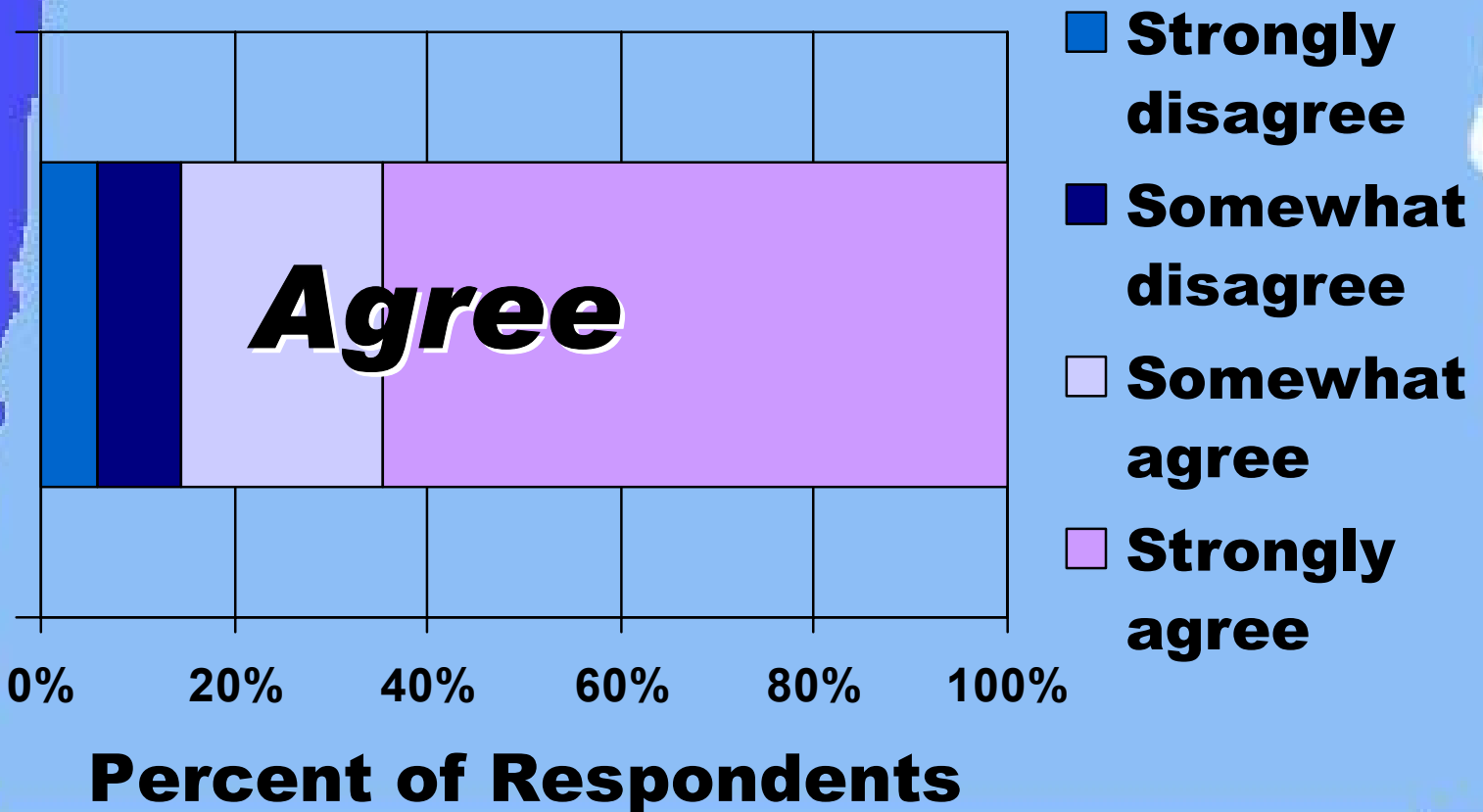


# How important is affordable health care for you and your family (on scale of 10)?

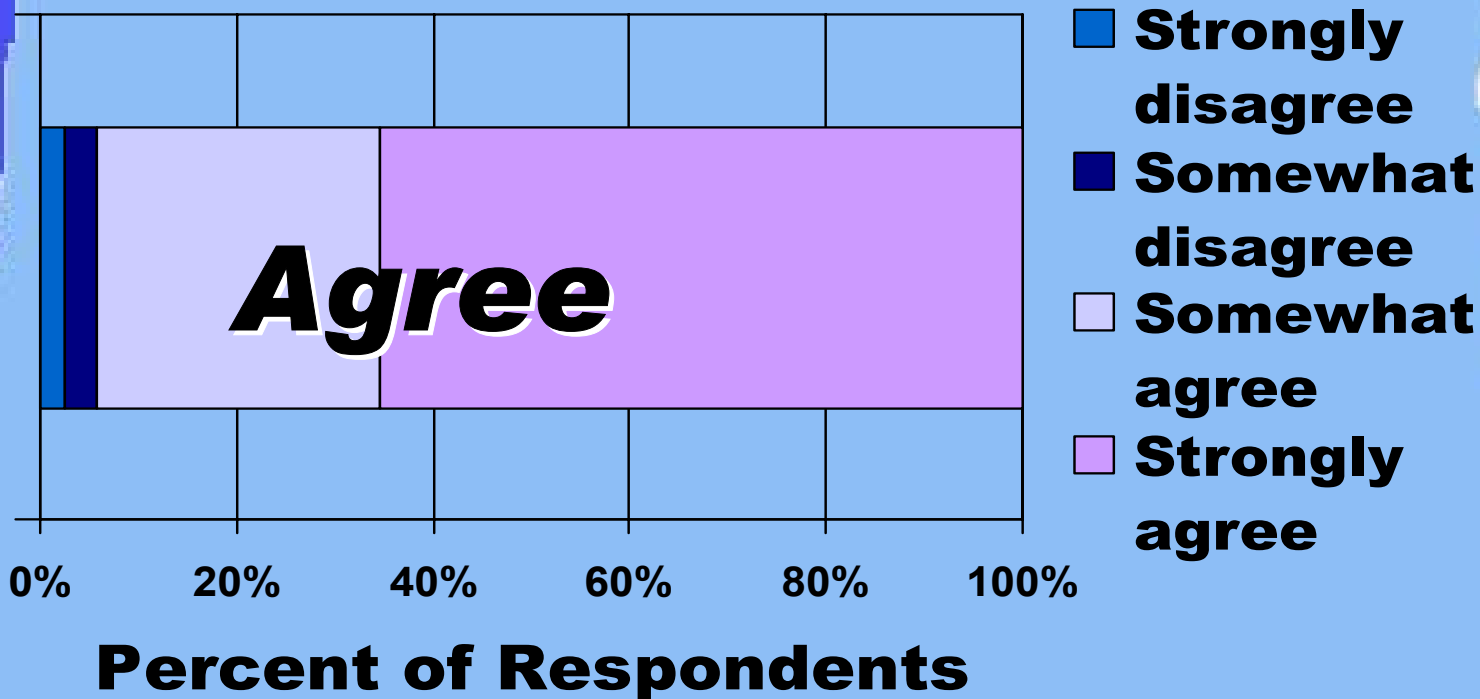
Score of  
9 or 10



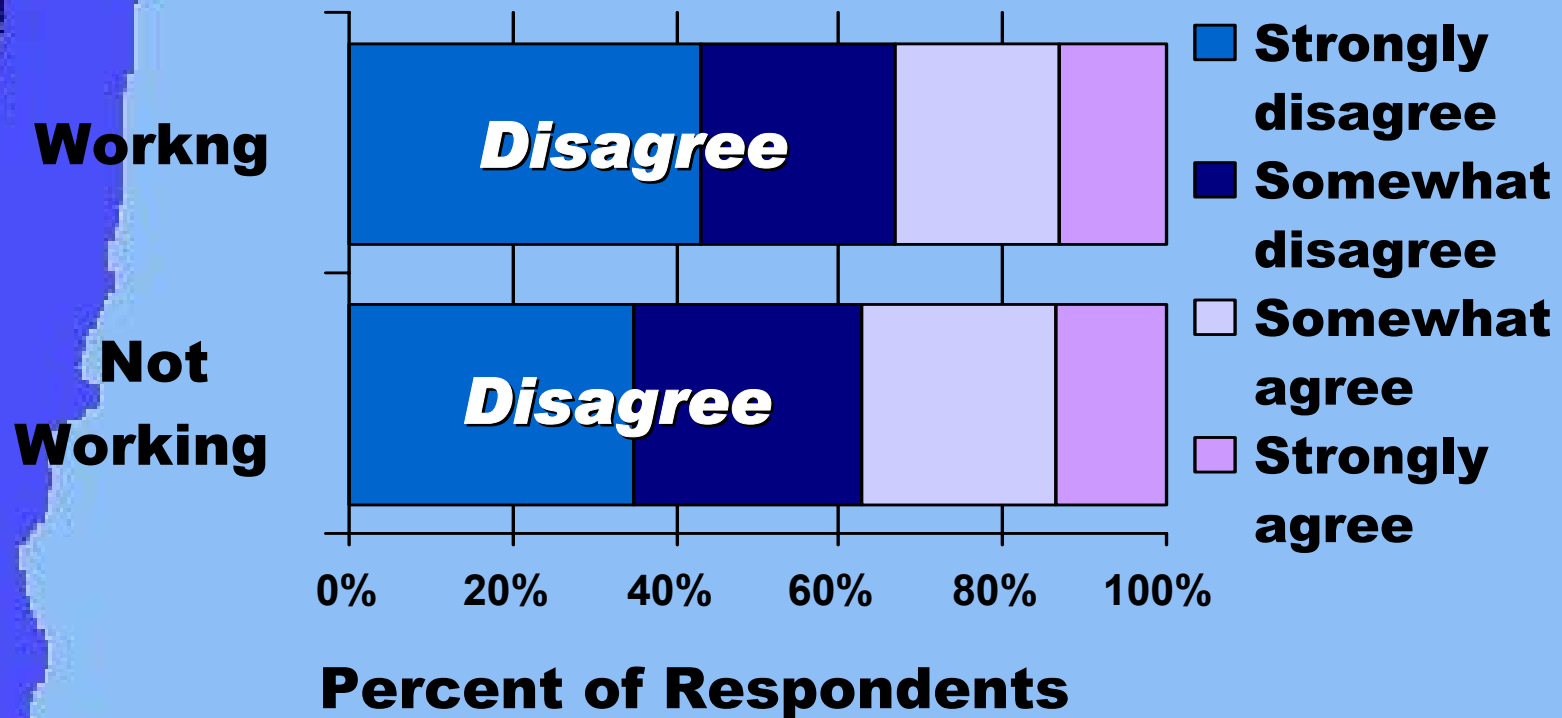
# All Oregonians should be guaranteed basic and routine health care services

- 8. Substance abuse treatment**



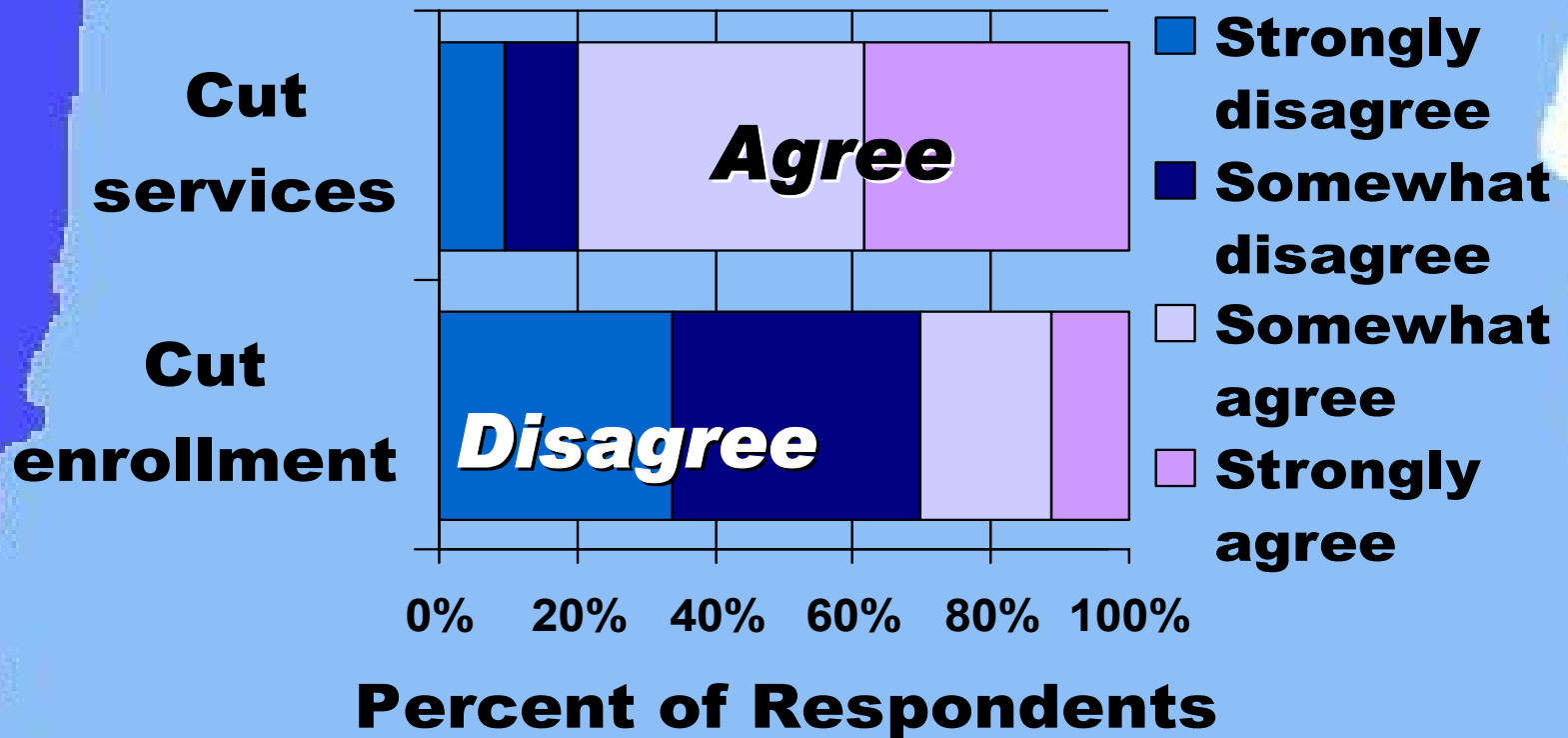


# **Priority among groups**
