


Survey FAQs

- What type of survey?
 - Computer-assisted telephone interview (randomly dialed)
- How many people?
 - >531
- Is that enough people?
 - Representative sample of the entire state
 - > Margin of error: ± 4.25%

What do you think is the #1 problem in Oregon health care?




How important is affordable health care for you and your family (on scale of 10)?





All Oregonians should be guaranteed basic and routine health care services




Percent of Respondents

Let uninsured Oregonians go without health insurance (use ER if needed)






Priority Among Services

- 2. Pregnant women
- 3. Adults age 65+
- 4. Children age 7 to 17
- 5. Adults age 18 to 64
