




Managing Rx Costs: The Tool Kit

What's Driving Medical Costs?


Percent of Total Cost Increase

What Drives Rx Cost?

Price

- Drug price inflation
- Volume discounts
- Dispensing fees

Utilization

- Demographics
- Consumer demand
- Prescriptions per member
- Days supply per Rx

Product

- New brand drugs
- Biotechnology
- Physician behaviors

Plan Design

- Co-pay structures
- Deductibles
- Out of pocket maximum
- Generic substitution





- © Create Incentives for Lower Cost Drugs
 - Co-insurance not co-payments
 - Tiered Co-insurance: generic/preferred/premium
 - Mandatory generic substitution
 - Drug coupons for generic & preferred brands



- © Co-Insurance vs Co-Payments
 - Use for both retail and mail order

20% vs \$20

- Make consumer & provider aware of cost of drugs and Rx alternatives
- Keep up with inflation

Sample Tiered Co-Insurance

- → Generic 10%
- ▶ Preferred Brand 20%
- ▶ Premium Brand 25%

- BCBS of Michigan
 - Generic substitution program
 - Generic Rx consumer awareness program
 - Consumer coupons for generics
 - Website with brand/generic prices
 - ➤ Average brand Rx = \$80
 - ➤ Average generic Rx = \$20

Generic Substitution saved BCBS \$97 million 2001 – 2003



- @ Generic/Preferred Brand Drug Coupon Program
 - Designed to promote the use of safe and effective lower cost medications
 - Drugs not available as samples because of their low price or generic drug status
 - Sample program: fill a new prescription for a 30 day supply of a generic or preferred brand, zero co-payment.

- @ Generic & Preferred Brand Drug Coupon Program
 - Plan members take coupons to providers
 - Provider writes new Rx
 - Take Rx to pharmacy with coupon
 - ➤ Zero Co-pay applies to new Rx
 - > Refills subject to co-pays/co-insurance



Cost Savings Techniques Manage Your Health Plans

Partner with Your Carrier

- → Negotiate Rx discounts
- Use a Formulary
- Require Pre-authorization for certain high cost drugs
- Drug Utilization Review
- Implement Disease Management Programs

Cost Savings Techniques Evidence Based Research

- Q. Does spending more on your drugs result in better outcomes?
- A. Not necessarily!
- Q. Are there effective alternatives that cost less?
- A. Probably!

- Oregon contracts with the OHSU Oregon Evidence-based Practice Center
 - Evidence-based review of all literature available on specific drug classes
 - No evidence that one drug more effective for most conditions
- Oregon Health Resources Commission reviews reports & determines which drugs are most safe and effective.
 - One-page summaries of the HRC reports available for consumers.



Cost Savings Techniques Evidence Based Research

- @ 12 drug classes reviewed, including:
 - Ace Inhibitors
 - **▶** Beta Blockers
 - Estrogen Therapy
 - Cholesterol Lowering Drugs (Statins)
 - Ulcer & GERD Drugs
 - Opoid Non-cancer Pain Drug

Cost Savings Techniques Information on Cost and Effectiveness

- "Prescription Drug Guide to Cost & Effectiveness"
 - ➡ Helps evaluate both cost & effectiveness
 - Uses results of Evidence Based Research Program
 - Arranged by drug classes
 - Most classes: no difference in effectiveness
 - Shows comparative prices for drugs in each class

 - **▶ Information on Oregon's Evidence Based Research Project**
 - Consumer-friendly summaries of the research for each category studied
 - Lists drugs in each category with brand names and generic equivalents
 - Lists average price for 30 day supply
