- Founded by President Lincoln in 1862

USDA and the PHS CC

- Food Safety and Inspection Service
- Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service



Mission of FSIS

To ensure that the nation's commercial supply of meat, poultry, and egg products is safe, wholesome, and correctly labeled and packaged.



FSIS' Public Health Role

- Inspect all meat, poultry, and egg products sold in interstate commerce
 - Birds and animals before and after slaughter
 - Eggs before and after breaking
 - Processed products
- Re-inspect imported products



FSIS' Public Health Role

 Test for microbiological, chemical, and other types of contamination

 Conduct epidemiological investigations of food-borne health hazards and disease outbreaks in cooperation with the CDC



FSIS' Public Health Role

Evaluate state and foreign inspection programs

Conduct enforcement activities



Emergency Preparedness And Response Roles

- Protect against intentional contamination of food
- Dealing with physical security, surveillance and monitoring, personnel security, and emergency response within inspected facilities or in the distribution chain
- Work with State and local governments

Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS)



Mission of APHIS

- To protect American agriculture by protecting against plant and animal pests and diseases
- Ensure animal welfare by enforcing the Animal Welfare Act
- Carrying out wildlife damage management activities



APHIS' Public Health Role

- Safeguards borders against foreign agricultural pests and diseases
- Eliminates foreign pests
- Combat domestic animal diseases
- Monitor wildlife diseases like rabies and Lyme disease; remove animals with zoonotic diseases

Response to intentional introduction of a domestic animal disease
