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DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY ANNOUNCES THE FIFTH ROUND OF THE ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANTS AWARDING \$22 MILLION TO AMERICA'S FIRE DEPARTMENTS

(Washington, DC) September 16, 2005 – The Department of Homeland Security today announced the fifth round of awards under the Fiscal Year 2005 Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program (AFGP), awarding 237 grants to fire departments throughout the United States.

AFGP will issue approximately 5,500 awards worth nearly \$600 million in direct assistance to firefighters and first responders throughout the country, demonstrating Homeland Security's commitment to ensuring that America's firefighters have the resources they need to protect their communities.

“We recognize the importance of the Fire Act Grants to our nation’s fire departments and we will continue to work closely with the fire service community to meet their needs,” said Matt A. Mayer, Acting Executive Director of the Office of State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness (SLGCP).

This fifth round of fire grants provides \$22,848,677 to help local fire departments and emergency medical services programs purchase or receive training, equipment, and response vehicles and implement first responder health and safety programs. “The Assistance to Firefighters grants represent a major effort by the federal government to ensure the nation’s firefighters continue to have the basic capability they require to do their jobs, improve safety and save lives,” said David Paulison, Administrator of the Department of Homeland Security’s United States Fire Administration.

The Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program is administered by the Department’s Office of State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness (SLGCP) in cooperation with the United States Fire Administration.

SLGCP is the principal federal agency responsible for the preparedness of the United States for acts of terrorism, including coordinating preparedness efforts at the federal level, and working with all state, local, tribal, parish, and private sector emergency response providers on all matters pertaining to combating terrorism, including training, exercises and equipment support. To support this mission, SLGCP administers a number of programs that provide a wide array of support to our nation's emergency preparedness and response community.
