Plant level

- Quantity and Quality (heat, sulfur, ash, <u>mercury</u> content) of receipts
- Commodity and Delivered cost
- Transportation Mode
- MSHA Number
- Ending Stocks
- Previous Month's Stocks + Receipts –
 Consumption +/- Adjustment = Ending Stocks



- Prime Mover/Boiler Level
 - Net and gross generation for all-electric plants
 - Gross generation for CHP plants
 - Consumption by fuel type and heat content
 - Boiler level for fossil fueled plants 10 MW or greater
 - Prime mover level for all other plants



- Annual Data on Sources and Disposition of Electricity
 - Sources
 - Gross Generation
 - Other Incoming Electricity
 - Disposition
 - Station Use
 - Direct Use
 - Wholesale Sales and Revenue
 - Retail Sales
 - Other Outgoing Electricity



- Annual Emissions Data: to be paid for by the Office of Fossil Energy
 - By Product Disposition
 - Financial Information
 - Cooling System, Annual Operations
 - Flue Gas Desulfurization, Annual Operations



Merged Form EIA-860/767 Proposal

- Move EIA-767 static information to EIA-860
 - Plant configuration
 - Air emissions standards
 - Boiler design parameters
 - NO_x emissions controls
 - Cooling system design parameters
 - Flue gas particulate collector design parameters
 - Stack and flue design parameters



Proposals for Form EIA-861

- Incentive-based demand response programs
 - Direct load control programs
 - Interruptible programs
 - Demand bidding/buyback programs
 - Emergency demand response
 - Capacity market programs
 - Ancillary service market programs
- Time-based rate programs
 - Real-time pricing
 - Critical peak pricing



Proposals for Form EIA-826

Add names of the ESP's for which distributors deliver electricity

Proposals for Form EIA-860M

No major changes

Proposals for Form EIA-411

- New Methodology to go from EIA-860 total capacity value to the NERC Net Capacity Resources value
- To become a mandatory form

Existing Confidential Data Elements

- Fuel cost (EIA-423)
- Fuel stocks (EIA-906, EIA-920)
- Monthly retail sales, revenue, and number of customers (energy service providers only) (EIA-826)
- Latitude and longitude (EIA-767, EIA-860)
- Maximum tested heat rate under full load conditions (EIA-860)
- Maps and power flow cases (EIA-411)



Potential Changes to Confidentiality Policy

- Remove confidentiality from latitude and longitude
- Release data 9 months after year end
 - Fuel cost
 - Fuel stocks
 - Monthly retail sales, revenue, and number of customers (energy service providers) (EIA-826)
- Publish data at aggregate level even if it does not conceal individual respondents' data
