Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Oct., 1889, requesting a "Statement of Service" of Preston Wells. The following information has been obtained from the files of this Office, and is furnished in reply to your inquiry. No. 277,799.

In the case of Preston Wells there is no original Enlistment or Muster-in Roll showing him to have been enrolled or mustered into the service of the United States as an enlisted man in Company H of the 2d<sup>st</sup> Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, on file in this Office up to date.

The Muster-Rolls of Company H of that Regiment contain the following evidence of service:

Enlisted as a Private at Perryville, Ky., 1862, at Lexington, Mo., to become a Corporal. From 1862 until January 1863 he was reported Private, 1st Battalion, 2d Illinois Infantry. On January 1, 1863, when reorganized, he became a Private in Hospital at Nashville. — Commissary sergeant in action at the battle of Stones River, Tenn., Jan. 1, 1863. Promoted to Corporal prior to May 31, 1863. Served under Capt. W. J. Adams during his absence. Sept. 20, 1863, Commissary sergeant in action at Chickamauga, Ga. Was captured and sent to Pottsboro, N. C. Roll Feb. 13, 1865, at Springfield, Ill., with the rank of Captain.

Enlisted by the enemy at the battle of Chickamauga, Ga., Sept. 20, 1863.

Copy of these records shows Capt. Preston Wells or Wells.

# DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act of May 1, 1920.

State of Missouri, County of Jasper,

On this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October, 1924, personally appeared Mrs. Margaret A. Wells before me the undersigned, who makes the following declaration as an application for pension under the provisions of the act of Congress approved May 1, 1920.

That she is 77 years of age, that she was born January 15<sup>th</sup>, 1847, at Barry County, Missouri, and that her post-office address is Joplin, Missouri, Route #1 - Box 585.

That she is the widow of Preston Wells, who ENLISTED 6<sup>th</sup> of January, 1862, at

Preston Wells; in Company H, 21<sup>st</sup> Illinois Infantry, (Name state company and regiment, if in the Army; or vessel, if in the Navy.)

DISCHARGED Feb., 13<sup>th</sup>, 1865, Springfield, Illinois, having served ninety days or more, or was discharged for, or died in service

of the United States of a disability incurred in the service in the line of duty, during the CIVIL WAR, and who

DIED October 19, 1924, at Joplin, Missouri, (Royal Heights)

That he also served in None. (Here give a complete statement of all other military, naval, or coast guard service, if any, at whatever time rendered.)

and that, except as herein stated, said soldier (or sailor) was not employed in the military or naval service of the United States; THAT SHE WAS MARRIED to said soldier (or sailor) July 9, 1870, at Washburn, Mo., by Williamson Beaman,

That she was NOT divorced from the soldier (or sailor) and that she has NOT remarried since his death;

# DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION

Acts of June 27, 1890, May 9, 1900, and July 1, 1902.

State of Missouri, County of Newton ss:

ON THIS 7 day of February, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and Three personally appeared before me, R. J. Mitchell Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid, Preston Wells aged 60 years, a resident of the City of Granby, County of Newton, State of Missouri who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Preston Wells who was Enrolled on the 6 day of January, 1862, in Private Co # 21 <sup>44</sup> (Here state rank, company, and regiment if in the military service, or vessel if in the navy, and all the service in the Federal Army.) Regiment Illinois infantry Volunteers in the service of the United States in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days and was Honorably Discharged at Springfield Ill, on the 13 day of February, 1865. That he has not been employed in the Military or Naval service of the United States, prior to January 6 1862.

That he is Totally unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of Chronic Hernia <sup>(Here name the disease or</sup>

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent, and have existed since his application. That he has applied for pension, the said claim being No. 321037.

That he has been a pensioner under Certificate No. 321037

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the Acts of June 27, 1890, of May 9, 1900, and of July 1, 1902.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, T. W. TALLMADGE of Washington, D. C., his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and to receive therefor a fee of ten dollars; that his Post-Office address is Granby, Missouri.
