Dear Brother I have not heard from home for a month and am very anxious to hear from there. This leaves me tolerable well I have cold yet. I thank God for the restoring of health for there is no thanks due to the officers for their good care of me while sick. I hope this will find you and family in good health. I have rote 2 or 3 letters to you and have not received but one from you. I think you might rite to me oftener than that. I have rote 5 to Caroline since I got here and ~~some~~ in care of them for you about getting a transfer for me. I want you to attend to that for me for I shall never be satisified here. We had inspection this morning and Capt. Edding has me an extra duty for having a shirt on that I have worn one week and they give us no soap not even for wash our hands let alone clothes. He has been wanting a chance at me all the time and this is the first he has got and he past men that had dirtyer shirts than mine and never said a word. but it he has get . . . it don't

Since riteing the foregoing page I have received a letter from Caroline the fifth October I was glad to hear from there once more. that you were all well. She did not tell me what all your prospect for living was and said you had sold all of the beef at half price. You must all do the best you can for it will take all I get here to keep me comfortable. I believe I had to pay \$15 for blanket to keep me warm.

All of the sick is sent to the Hospital (site ?) and several others of our company is gone I dont know where they are at lieutenant Ed Pierce has got to me. He has time to spare and says that the soldiers

If Caroline needs any go and get it and give an obligation for it payable at the close of the war at a fare price it is said that all up to 45 will have to go. I dont want you to go. You had better hide in the swamp than to go to the army for it will do no good. I want you to rite to me often and remember me in your prayers. Your Brother until death

Since writing the foregoing page I have
received a letter from Caroline the 1st in
the letter I was glad to hear from her and

Here still the sick is sent to the

present Ed Prince has got to go he has
come to space and says that the soldiers are
not getting it well the money with Prince
is not at all. If Caroline need anything
get it and give an obligation for it pay
it at the close of the year at a price fixed
it is all that all up to us will have to go I
don't want you to go you had better stay in the
camp than to go to the army for it will
do no good. I don't want to write to much but
remember to me in your prayers I have but
