FLINT-KNAPPING WORKSHOP Participate in a hands-on workshop where you will learn how to make your own arrowheads from obsidian. Fred Velasquez will teach age-old techniques of "flint-knapping" which are still used by native peoples of today. Age 16 and older. Class size limited. 
