WEAVING BASKETS & ME-WUK LIFEWAYS

Begin with an introduction to the Sierra Me-Wuk history, followed by a short walk to an ancient Me-Wuk Indian site. Here you will meet local Me-Wuks who will captivate you with stories of their Indian heritage. On alternating weeks, Arvada Fisher will teach you how to start a pine needle basket. A \$10 material fee for her program is requested. Meet at the Summit Ranger Station.

WHAT'S BUGGIN' YOU? Children and their parents discover life within the aquatic ecosystem and print a T-shirt with stamps and molds depicting creatures of this fascinating world. Material fee, \$6 includes t-shirt, use of stamps and paint. Meet at the Pinecrest Chalet, approximately 1 mile up Dodge Ridge Road on the right. Look for the carved wooden bear!

CRITTERS, CONIFERS & CLAY Learn about the plants and animals of the forest by creating fun clay projects. Children under seven must be assisted by an adult. Sign up at the Pinecrest Amphitheater one hour before program. Space is limited, shipping available for extra cost.

INCREDIBLE EARTHWORKS OF 1858 Hike to an amazing flume and ditch system built by gold miners in 1858 to carry water from the mountains all the way to Columbia over 60 miles away. You'll drive six miles of paved road and two miles of good dirt road. The walk is fairly short and gentle, but portions are in the sun, so bring a hat and water. Round trip about 2 ¹/₂ hours. Meet at Summit Ranger Station.

MAKING TRACKS Through games and hand-on activities, you'll discover our forest animals and learn how to let wildlife be wild. Make tracks of your own from molds. Meet at the Pinecrest
