
Alvar

Contain rare and/or endemic species















Great Lakes Alvars

- Threatened by incompatible land uses


















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- Threatened by incompatible land uses

- Lack of awareness about alvar habitats






A collaborative effort aimed at providing a unified, consistent approach to understanding and conserving the Great Lakes' rare and vulnerable alvar ecosystems






Major Accomplishments

- 5. Awareness of uniqueness & value of alvars






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


Degree of Protection
