

### Waste-Free Factories Criteria

- 90% reduction in solid waste to landfills
- 90% reduction in air emissions
- 90% reduction in hazardous waste
- Incorporate 25% post-consumer recycled materials in parts and packaging
- Energy usage within 10% of optimum level for facility



#### Percent Recycled, Reused 156% increase since 1990




Business Result - 3R's: \$47 million in 1999

•27% reduction in Total TRI Releases To Environment between 1998 and 1999


•Releases to Environment decreased 88% since 1991



•Dichloromethane emissions reduced 10-fold since 1991




### Waste Free Products Energy Savings



 95% of Xerox products launched in 1999 met the requirements of the Energy Star® program




### Waste-Free Products Supplies Returns Programs






### Waste-Free Products Equipment Remanufacture & Parts Reuse/Recycle
