OPPORTUNITY: Free Teacher/Youth Leader Training on Invasive Plants and Biocontrol to be Held from August 5 to 7

Elko, Nevada...Attention all teachers and youth leaders - are you looking for a fun way to get children interested in hands-on and relevant issues in their own backyard? The "Bugs with an Attitude Institute" will be held at the Great Basin College in Elko from August 4 through August 7, 2008. The course is designed for educators interested in teaching youth about native ecosystems and the threat from invasive plants.

Participants will learn:

- How to identify noxious weeds;
- How weeds affect the native plants:
- Why noxious weeds are such a threat; and,
- How to use some insects as biological agents to slow the spread of invasive plants.
