## Media advisory on nuclear facilities

ARGONNE, Ill. (October 19, 2007) – As previously announced in July 2007, Argonne National Laboratory ceased experimental work at one of its nuclear facilities pending evaluation of operational issues. Based on our analyses, Argonne has made a decision not to pursue the necessary upgrades required for resumption of nuclear experimental work at this facility.
