- TJSO to finalize commitment 23 & 25 assessment and develop action plans for submission to DOE HQ NLT 13 February 2006





TJSO's ISM Re-invigoration Efforts Since FY04

- Due to unfavorable DART and TRC rates TJSO began re-invigorating its ISM program at the end of FY04
- In FY05 Major Accomplishments in Safety have been seen
 - TJSO added additional Safety Staff to assist in oversight
 - Prompted the Lab to develop a Comprehensive Safety Strategy to address poor DART and TRC performance
 - Developed an OA program in advance of DOE O 226.1 which incorporates all oversight activities
 - Re-established its formal EH&S assessment program where multiple EH&S formalized assessment are conducted by the Site Office each QTR
 - Additional ISC participation and assistance was obtained for TJSO's EH&S assessment activities
 - Increased communication and collaboration between the Site Office and the Laboratory
- Key initiative to the continued success of ISM is improving Site Office Feedback mechanism with the Laboratory





TJSO's Proposed Improvement Actions

- Revise the current TJSOs' Operational Assessment Plan to address gaps identified in the Commitments 23 & 25 review
- Finalize Site Office's Operational Awareness Log to better document the oversight activities to bridge any gaps identified by Commitments 23 & 25 CRDs
- Develop a mechanism to track and trend the results of oversight activities performed
- Identify and implement new ways to improve feedback to the Laboratory such as:
 - QTRLY status meetings to formally benchmark successes and opportunities for improvement
 - Monthly meeting with key EH&S individuals to review progress
 - Standardize submittals to the Laboratory
- Work with the Lab to evaluate and balance emerging requirements while in the stages of contract re-compete
