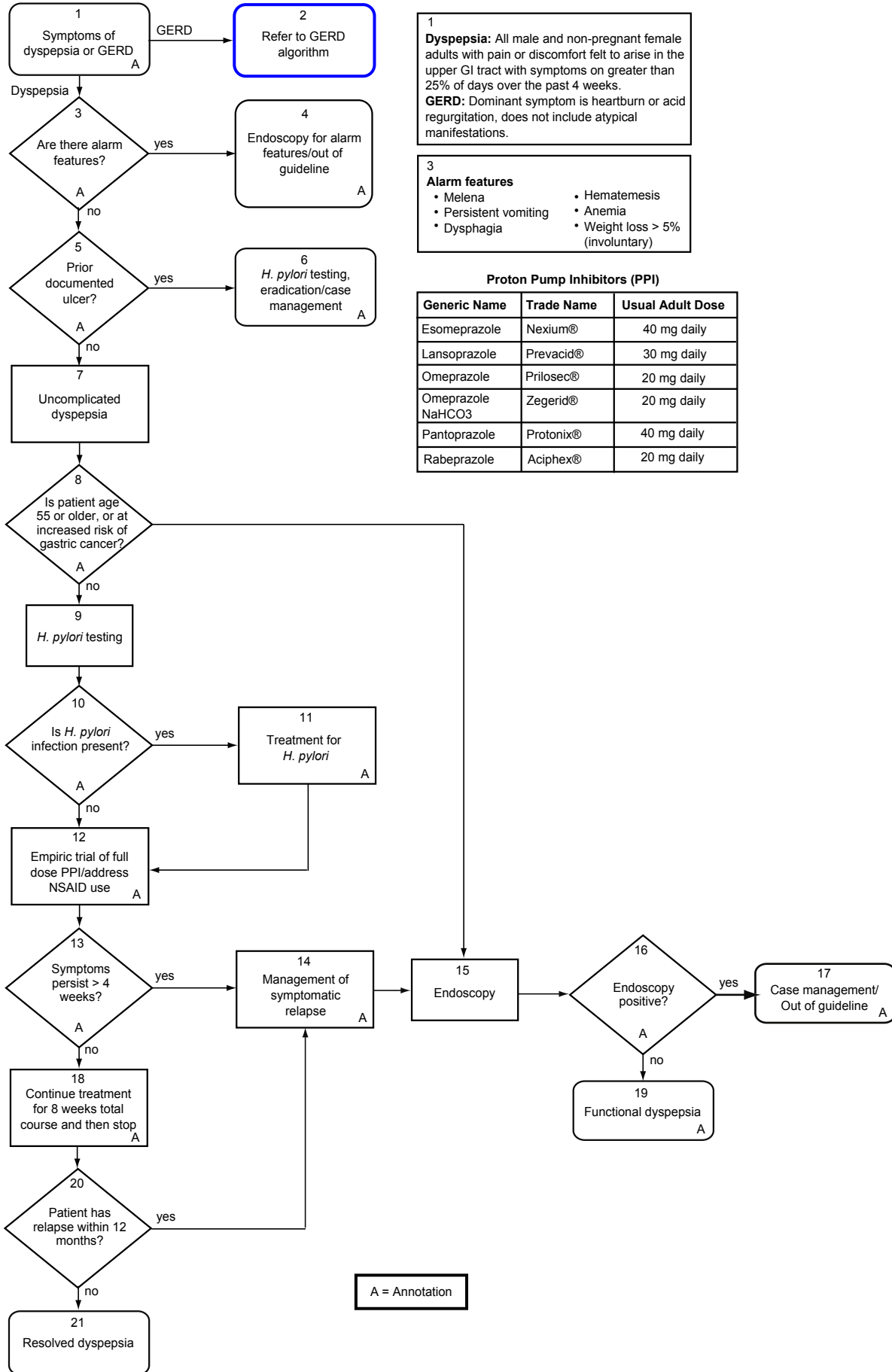


Initial Management of Dyspepsia and GERD

Dyspepsia: All male and non-pregnant female adults with pain or discomfort felt to arise in the upper GI tract with symptoms on greater than 25% of days over the past 4 weeks.
GERD: Dominant symptom is heartburn or acid regurgitation, does not include atypical manifestations.

Alarm features

- Melena
- Persistent vomiting
- Dysphagia
- Hematemesis
- Anemia
- Weight loss > 5% (involuntary)

Proton Pump Inhibitors (PPI)

Generic Name	Trade Name	Usual Adult Dose
Esomeprazole	Nexium®	40 mg daily
Lansoprazole	Prevacid®	30 mg daily
Omeprazole	Prilosec®	20 mg daily
Omeprazole NaHCO3	Zegerid®	20 mg daily
Pantoprazole	Protonix®	40 mg daily
Rabeprazole	Aciphex®	20 mg daily
