
Habitat: Occurs along forest, field, stream and wetland edges, and in open woods, preferring moist habitats.

General Description: A typical blackberry appearance, except for the conspicuous and distinctive reddish, glandular hairs that cover all parts of the plant.

Distinctive Characteristics: The leaves are alternate along the stems and are divided into three heart-shaped leaflets with purple veins and toothed margins.

Growth Habit: Subshrub

Distribution: Found from New England and eastern Canada to North Carolina and west to Michigan and Tennessee.
