#### **SHEEP and LAMBS**



The New England sheep and lamb inventory on January 1, 2008, totaled 48,000 head, an increase of 4,000 head from a year earlier. Breeding stock totaled 40,500 head at the first of the year, an 11 percent increase from 2007. There were 36,000 lambs born on New England farms during 2007, compared to 32,000 born

during 2006. Wool production in the six-state region totaled 266,000 pounds in 2007, up three percent from 2006.

Average prices received for sheep averaged \$46 per cwt, a reduction of \$4 per cwt from a year earlier. Producers received \$120 per cwt for lamb marketings in 2007, \$5 per cwt less than in 2006. Inventory expansion and increased value per head placed the total value of New England's sheep and lamb inventory at \$10.1 million, 13 percent above the previous year. The number of New England farms with one or more sheep on hand at any time during the year totaled 2,200 in 2007, an increase of 150 operations from the previous year.
