We also appreciate the cooperation and support extended by the New England Commissioners of Agriculture (CT, ME, MA and NH), the Chief of the Rhode Island Division of Agriculture and Marketing, and the Vermont Secretary of the Agency of Agriculture. Without their financial contribution, this annual bulletin would not be printed.
