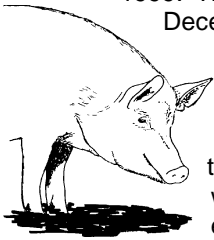


## HOGS & PIGS

During 2000, there were a total of 1,600 operations with one or more hogs on hand in New England, a decrease of 60 from 1999. The inventory of all hogs and pigs on farms on December 1, 2000 totaled 40,500 head, 3 percent more than the previous year. Inventories increased in Connecticut, New Hampshire and Rhode Island by a total of 500 head, decreased in Maine by 500 head, and stayed the same in Massachusetts and Vermont, when compared with totals from a year earlier. Throughout the six-state region, there

was an increase of more than 5 percent in the number of breeding hogs from the previous year, and market hog inventories increased 2 percent from 1999 levels. The December 1 inventory value of \$3.4 million was 8 percent above 1999. The total pig crop in New England increased 5 percent from 1999, with 67,200 pigs born in 2000. Marketings totaled 66,700 head during 2000, up 2 percent from the previous year. An increase in the average price per 100 pounds from \$31.00 in 1999 to \$40.00 in 2000, coupled with increased marketings, resulted in a 31 percent increase in gross income to \$6.7 million in 2000.
