SHEEP and LAMBS

As of January 1, 2007 sheep and lambs on New England farms totaled 44,000, a decrease of 3,000 head from the previous year. Breeding stock totaled 36,500 head at the first of the year, nearly a 10 percent decrease from the previous year. Sheep inventory nationwide declined by nearly one percent from the previous year. Average prices received for New England sheep and lambs decreased by five and ten dollars per hundredweight respectively from 2005 to 2006. New England's value of inventory was estimated at nearly

\$8.9 million a decrease of seven percent from the previous year due to reduced inventory and lower prices. New England's wool production was 259,000 pounds in 2006, a decrease of 12 percent from 2005. Producers received an average of 55 cents per pound for wool, an increase of ten cents per pound from 2005 sales. The number of New England farms, with one or more sheep on hand at any time during the year was placed at 2,050 in 2006, an increase of 50 operations from the previous year.
