




Horizontal axis = Ownership

Vertical axis = Organisation








Horizontal axis = Ownership

The NBS - A Nationalised Service

- 99% tax funded since 1948
- Integral part of NHS
- Reports directly to Department of Health






NBS - Statutory Functions

- Provision of laboratories for manufacture of blood products
- Collection, screening and processing blood and its constituents
- Supplying blood, plasma and other blood products for the purposes of the Health Service
- Preparation and supply of plasma fractions and other products for therapeutic, diagnostic and other purposes
- Manufacture and supply of blood grouping reagents and other related reagents
- Promotion, by advertisement and otherwise, of giving blood for the purposes of the Health Service with a view to maintaining an adequate number of persons who are willing to give blood




Department of Health

- Agrees NBS developments






Role of the Regulator

- Europe Blood Safety Directive will have an impact










Predictable - Emergency Plan in Routine Use

- Internal
 - Equipment failure
 - Fires
- External
 - Major incidents/accidents
 - Public utility failures
 - Weather conditions





Predictable - Established Resilience Strategies

- Standardised practices
- Common quality standards
- Common labelling practices
- Don't rely on single supplier
- External supplier audits
- Balance safety, sufficiency, cost





Unpredictable - Extending the Emergency Plan

- Internal
 - Massive loss of NBS services
 - Massive loss of donor supply
- External
 - Terrorism
 - War
 - New threats to blood safety





Unpredictable - Extending Resilience

- Different scenarios
- Different solutions

NB - Many of the unknown unknowns have a global impact





Plasma Fractionation - Role of BPL

- Is fully Government-owned
- Operates in competitive market
- Objective Assure security of supply
- Does not meet all English demand
- Responds to UK market shortfalls
- Pre 1999 UK plasma
- Post 1999 US plasma
- 2003 Purchase of US plasma supply by UK Government
