- Meet and socialize with your colleagues



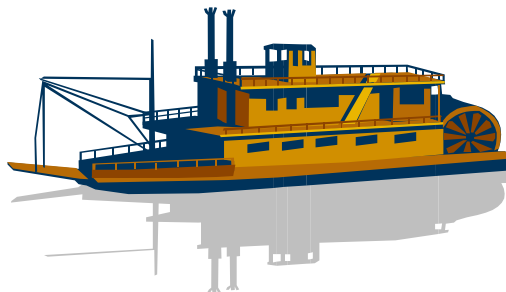
## Tuesday, August 1

3:15 - 4:15 p.m. Tour of UMESC

- Board the bus in front of the Radisson for a tour of the Upper Midwest Environmental Sciences Center.
- The Center houses a large fish culture area, wet labs, and an invasive species complex.
- Return to the Radisson to prepare for the evening cruise.

6:30 - 8:30 p.m. Riverboat cruise

- Walk north through beautiful Riverside Park to board the La Crosse Queen, a modern day replica of a 19<sup>th</sup> century paddlewheel riverboat.
- The dock is located next to the original Fish Control Lab, which now houses the Riverside Museum.
- Help yourself to a light lunch in the climate-controlled lower deck (cash bar) or head up to the canopied, open top deck as the boat heads upriver through one of the most scenic areas in the Midwest.



## Wednesday, August 2

5:15 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. Picnic

- Take another short bus ride to the home of Roz and Ron Schnick on the east shore of Lake Onalaska
- Enjoy a meal featuring whole roast hog and all the fixins'.
- 2 return trips to the Radisson. The first is at 6:45 p.m. and a final bus will leave at 8:30 p.m.

### Another option

- La Crosse Loggers' baseball at the Lumberyard in Copeland Park
- The game starts at 7:05 p.m.
- The bus going to the Schnick's could drop you off about 5:30 p.m. which would allow you to check out Old Towne North's antique stores and shops on Caledonia Street.
- Or the 6:45 p.m. bus returning downtown from the picnic could drop you off at the Lumberyard.
- You can purchase tickets at the game for \$4 to \$6, or opt for a Party Deck Pass for \$24 which entitles you to seating in the lower Timber Terrace and all you care to eat and drink (pop, lemonade, beer, burgers, brats, chicken sandwiches, hot dogs, etc.)
- To return to the Radisson after the game, you can catch a city bus (\$1) or take a 2 mile hike south on Copeland.
