Dear Interested Party

On October 20, 2006, I made the decision to implement Alternative B (modified) as described in the Olympic Discovery Trail Environmental Assessment (EA) and Decision Notice for the Environmental Assessment. This decision authorizes granting an easement to Clallam County to build and maintain approximately 12.1 miles of recreation trail (which will become part of the larger Olympic Discovery Trail) across National Forest System Land (see enclosed map) as described in the EA (EA pages 14-16). Approximately 3.74 miles will consist of new trail construction, reconstruction of railroad grade to trail, and improvement of existing trail and non-system road to trail. These segments will prohibit motorized traffic except for administrative purposes. The remaining approximately 8.32 miles will consist of existing Forest Service roads that will allow shared use with motorized traffic (some of which will be improved by paving with asphalt).

This decision is subject to appeal pursuant to Forest Service regulations at 36 CFR 215 by individuals or organizations who provided comment or otherwise expressed interest in the proposed action during the comment period. Any appeal must be filed to the Appeal Deciding Officer within 45 days following publication of legal notice of the decision in the newspaper of record, *The Olympian*. The publication date of notice of the decision is the sole means of calculating the appeal filing deadline. See the Administrative Review or Appeal Opportunities section of the Decision Notice for details on filing appeals.
