Maintain a comprehensive computer list of spill removal resources, personnel and equipment that is available worldwide





6 Months Prior to Exercise

NSFCC/G-MOR attend Regional Response Team (RRT) Meeting.

NSFCC notifies COTP of intended Preparedness Assessment Visit (PAV).

4-6 Months Prior to Exercise

NSFCC's Response Resource Assessment Branch (RRAB) assembles names, locations, and equipment listings for OSRO (& non-OSRO) response organizations located within a 70-mile radius of the exercise location.

RRAB coordinates scheduling the PAV with COTP as well as DRAT, EPA (as applicable) and other federal/state response agencies.

3-4 Months Prior to Exercise

RRAB completes the Preparedness Assessment Visit – verifying core resources

•Conducts in-brief with COTP/XO/OPS (First Day);

•Conducts classroom training on federal regulations, job aid, Average Most Probable Discharge (AMPD) coverage;

•Conducts onsite verifications of equipment and employee training;

•Observes operation of 10% of equipment;

•Conducts verbal out-brief with COTP/XO/OPS (Last Day).

Post Preparedness Assessment Visit Actions

RRAB prepares written After-Action Report (to COTP, info G-MOR, District, Strike Team).

RRI Database Manager updates RRI computer inventory information for OSROs (and add non-OSRO assets).

RRAB notifies OSROs of potential change in classification.

RRI Database Manager updates the OSRO matrix on the intra- and internet.

NSFCC reports results of PAV at the next RRT meeting.

OSRO Classification

Why?

- Reduces equipment information required in response plan
- Help us monitor response capability

What?

- Voluntary!!!
- Planning based
- NOT a certification



OSRO Classification


How?

- COTP zone/Alternate Classification Cities (ACCs)
- Operating area
- Spill size
- Response time
- Core equipment

Average Most Probable Discharge (AMPD)

Deploy 1,000 feet of boom within 1 hour.
 Provide 50 bbls/ day EDRC within 2 hours.
 Provide 100 bbls of TSC within 2 hours.

OSRO Guidelines (27 April 2001)
 – NSFCC no longer classifies OSROs for AMPD.
 – Plan holders verify and certify AMPD coverage.
 – COTP validates.



AMPD

Field Responsibilities

- Facility plan review
- Existing field activities
- Government-led unannounced exercises
- Actual events



Alternative Compliance

General Guidance:

- COTP approves requests that necessitate knowledge of specific zone (ex. boom requests)
- HQ G-RPP-2 approves EDRC/TSC/travel speed requests (national impact)

Exemptions: G-RPP-2 (via COTP) for approval

Approval:

- Dated letter to OSRO, copy to NSFCC
- OSRO applies for reapproval 3 years from date of letter
