
G7/EC Funding Channels for HIV/AIDS Commitments, by Donor, 2004

(Excluding Funding for HIV/AIDS Research)



This graph understates the U.S. commitment because it does not include significant U.S. funding for research in the area of HIV/AIDS. In FY 2004, the United States provided total of \$2.3 billion for global HIV/AIDS, TB, and HIV/AIDS research. If funding for global TB initiatives is excluded, but the funding for HIV/AIDS research is included, U.S. funding for global HIV/AIDS was approximately \$2.0 billion in FY 2004.

* Percentages represent the portion of a country's HIV/AIDS commitments through the Global Fund or Bilateral Programs, respectively. Combined Global Fund and Bilateral percentages equal 100 for each country. Italy's contribution to Bilateral Programs accounted for 100% of the country's total contribution in FY 2004.

** Global Fund contributions are adjusted to represent the estimated HIV/AIDS share of Global Fund grant distribution by disease through 2004 (60% of total contribution). Canada's Global Fund Contribution was provided in Canadian FY 2004, but outside of Global Fund FY 2004, and is counted here as part of Canada's FY 2004 funding for HIV/AIDS.

*** Bilateral data from Japan, U.K., France, and certain other Development Assistance Committee (DAC) countries are preliminary estimates only.
