

## Where to Get Vaccine Information Statements

1. **The Internet.** All current VISs are available on the internet from two websites:
  - CDC ([www.cdc.gov/vaccines/pubs/vis/default.htm](http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/pubs/vis/default.htm))
  - The Immunization Action Coalition ([www.immunize.org/vis/](http://www.immunize.org/vis/))VISs from these sites can be downloaded as pdf files and printed.
2. **CDC's Immunization Works CD.** This CD contains pdf files for all VIS (current as of the date the CD was issued). *Immunization Works* is usually available at CDC's immunization booth at conferences or can be ordered through CDC's online publications order form at [https://www2a.cdc.gov/nchstp\\_od/PIWeb/niporderform.asp](https://www2a.cdc.gov/nchstp_od/PIWeb/niporderform.asp).
3. **State Health Departments.** CDC sends each state health department's immunization program camera-ready copies when a new VIS is published. The programs, in turn, can provide copies to providers within the state.

**Audio files** for most VISs can be downloaded from CDC's VIS webpage.

**Text versions** of VISs can also be accessed from CDC's VIS webpage. These files are compatible with screen-reader devices for use by the vision-impaired.

**Translations** of many VISs are available in more than 30 languages from the Immunization Action Coalition's website ([www.immunize.org/vis/index.htm](http://www.immunize.org/vis/index.htm)). Languages available include:
