Before you start to develop a conservation bank, run the idea by us. We will have to approve the bank before you can sell credits. This page explains what we need in order to help you.

Credits – Tell us what conservation credits do you propose selling.
Service Area
Provide a map of your proposed service area. This is the area     within which you have to call gradity. (You may need to have

- See our <u>list of current banks</u> for examples of service areas.
- If the species in your proposed bank have <u>recovery plans</u>, consider using one or more recovery units as your service area.

#### \_\_ Location

- Address of the proposed bank.
- General map showing bank location. This should allow us to place the bank in reference to cities, rivers and other major geographic features.
- U.S. Geological Survey <u>7.5 minute topo map</u> on which you have drawn the boundaries of the bank.
- Aerial photo of the bank and surrounding properties. These can be created in <u>maps.google.com</u> and other web pages.

#### \_\_ Site description

- Brief description of the site conditions and habitats.
- Species known or potentially present.
- Description of wetlands, waters and hydrology if relevant.

#### You may also want to include:

Photographs of the site.	
Proposed enhancements.	
Site history including past land uses.	
Surrounding land uses and zoning. Anticipated future development is surrounding area.	n the
