TVA endorses the comments provided by the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) in response to the above proposed generic communication. As the NRC knows, TVA is one of many licensees which has put significant resources into and made great strides in establishing and maintaining a safety-conscious work environment. TVA shares the concerns described by NEI that the "across the board" approach taken by the subject Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) may indeed be counterproductive. The RIS, as written, can become a prescriptive tool and is fraught with subjectivity. We continue to believe that in matters related to safety-conscious work environment, it should be left up to the licensee--the entity ultimately responsible for establishing and maintaining that environment-- to implement those practices and programs best suited to its particular circumstances and needs.

TVA urges NRC to fully consider and adopt the views expressed by NEI on this very important matter and reconsider the need to issue a safety-conscious work environment RIS.
