Agricultural Research Service's Sidney Lab to Host Scientific Conference on Wheat Stem Sawfly

The Fourth International Wheat Stem Sawfly Conference will be held Oct. 13-14 at the Agricultural Research Service's Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory (NPARL) in Sidney, Mont. ARS is the chief scientific research agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The 1-1/2-day conference, held only every three to five years, brings together scientists from across the region, the Prairie Provinces of Canada, and from Montpelier, France, to discuss ongoing and future research into the biological, cultural and chemical control of wheat stem sawfly.

The scientific presentations will begin at 8 a.m. on Oct. 13 and are open to the public. Time is also being set aside to allow for producer input and a question-and-answer session with the scientists, in addition to separate sessions for scientists to discuss collaborations between the different universities, agencies and disciplines represented.

Topics for the conference include discussions on the genetics of the wheat stem sawfly and new wheat varieties intended to help combat the pest, as well as biological and cultural management research and survey information. Among the scheduled presenters are wheat breeders Luther Talbert and Phil Bruckner, entomologists David Weaver and Kevin Delany, and chemical ecologist Micaela Buteler, all with Montana State University–Bozeman; cereal agronomist Brian Beres and entomologist Hector Carcamo of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, Lethbridge, Alberta; Scott Meers with Alberta's Agriculture Food and Rural Development Centre; and entomologist Walker Jones and molecular biologist Marie-Claude Bon, both with the USDA-ARS European Biological Control Laboratory in Montpellier, France.

The wheat stem sawfly is a serious pest in the Northern Great Plains and Canada, causing yield losses of more than \$100 million a year, with annual losses in Montana alone exceeding \$25 million.

ARS operates more than 100 research facilities across the United States, including the Sidney laboratory.
