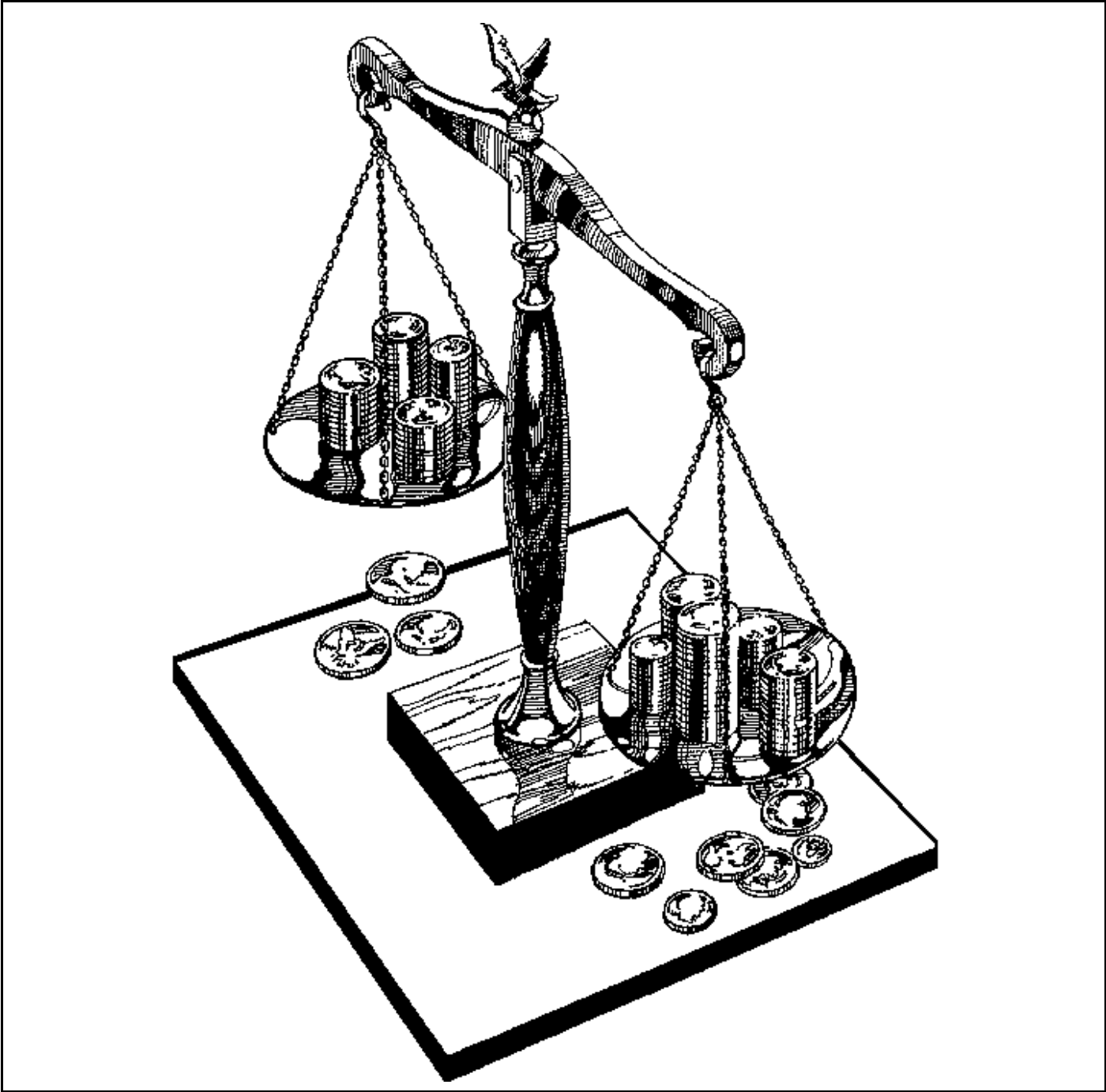


# SUMMARY OF COUNTY AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

GROSS VALUES BY COMMODITY GROUPS -- CALIFORNIA 1989-1990



# 1990 SUMMARY

The County Crop Reports for 1990 reflected another good year for California's agriculture by showing an overall increase of 7%, the same as the 1988-1989 gain. Since both increases were posted in what were considered drought years, the adaptability of ranchers and growers to current conditions is evident.

Changes varied between crop groups.

Within each crop the following are notable:

- ! Tulare became number one in milk
- ! Fresno retained a of the cotton and ¼ of the grapes
- ! Fresno moved up to second place in lettuce
- ! Stanislaus took the lead in almonds
- ! San Diego's lead in flowers and foliage gained from 34.3% to 41.4%
- ! Fresno passed the a mark in share of processing tomatoes
- ! Monterey strengthened its lead in strawberries, going from 24.9% to 34.7%
- ! Fresno gained 10 percentage points in turkeys.
- ! Ventura still has more than ½ of the State's lemons.

Looking at groups of products, it appears that the big counties are getting bigger:

- ! Fresno increased its proportion of the State total by 0.6%
- ! Tulare gained 1% in its proportion of the State's fruits and nuts
- ! Monterey increased its lead in total vegetables by 0.8%
- ! San Diego gained 3.2% in its proportion of the State's nursery and flowers
- ! Tulare's additional milk gave it a gain of 1.4% in the total livestock products category
- ! Fresno picked up 4.1% in the poultry and poultry products category

## NOTES TO THE AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONER DATA

The gross value of production published in this report includes all farm production whether sold into usual marketing channels or used on the farm where produced. Values placed on pasture and range feed are included, and fresh fruit and vegetable crop values are based on the free on board (f.o.b.) packed price. Values are recorded for all products grown during the calendar year regardless of when they are marketed. The County Agricultural Commissioners' Reports also provide statistics on a broader range of commodities than estimates prepared by other agencies.

Because of these concepts, the State total for gross dollar values summarized here differs from the cash receipts to farmers estimated by the California Agricultural Statistics Service released earlier in the year. The larger total value reported by the Agricultural Commissioners results from the different definitions that are used in estimating total value of production rather than cash receipts to producers.

Some counties are now including timber as a part of their crop report, following the pattern set by the County Agricultural Commissioners' Association. Since it is not comparable to earlier county summaries, this has not been made a part of the main tables of this summary. The total value reported by the counties including timber is 4.1 percent greater than the \$22.2 billion recorded on page 5 in this bulletin.

The decision to not include horses in the county crop reports was taken at the 1990 County Agricultural Commissioners' meeting. In some cases, this change creates a decline in total value between 1989 and 1990.

### Top Ten Crops (Pages 10-11)

For this ranking nursery products and flowers and foliage have been combined. Also some other groupings have been made that will make these lists vary slightly from those published by the counties. These lists were prepared for the county profiles published by the California State Department of Finance.

## OTHER AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Additional information on major crops produced in the State is available in a series of "dot maps" that show the physical distribution of crop production within the State, accompanied by county and State statistics on acreage, production, value, average yield and value, as reported by the County Agricultural Commissioners. Data from the Agricultural Commissioner reports from 1980 through the most recent reports are available on tape.
