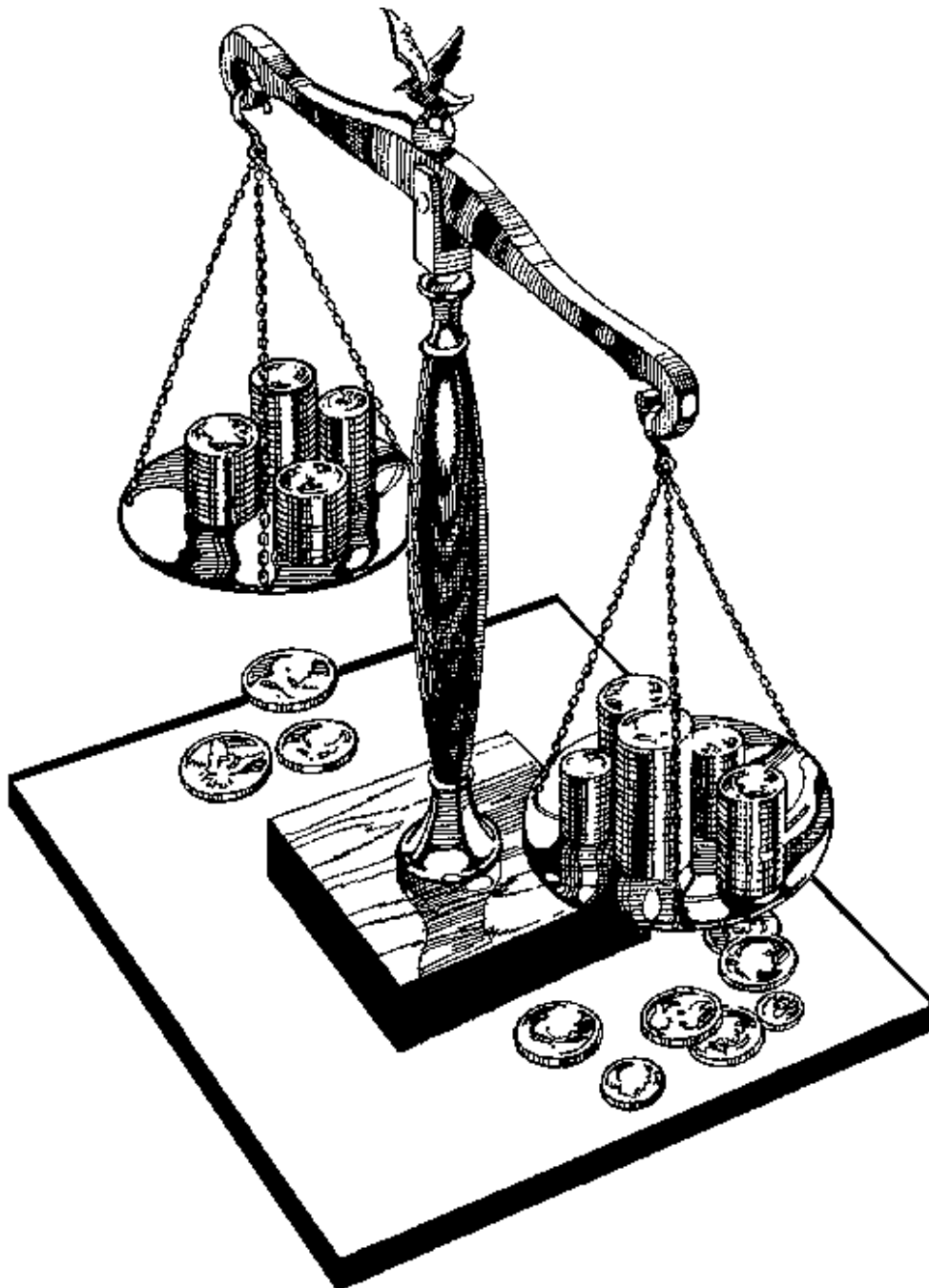


SUMMARY OF COUNTY AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

GROSS VALUES BY COMMODITY GROUPS -- CALIFORNIA 1990-1991



1991 SUMMARY

The County Crop Reports for 1991 show a one billion dollar decrease; a 4.5 percent reduction from the 1990 level. The combined effects of a hard freeze, a continued drought and lower prices for major crops such as hay, milk and cotton reduced the value of agricultural products from California farms and ranches in 1991. Higher values of some fruits and vegetables could not offset these losses.

Changes in the 1991 product rankings reflect the effects of the December 1990 freeze on oranges, the lower prices received for hay in 1991 and the continued strength of high value vegetables, fruits and nuts such as lettuce, strawberries and almonds.

Gains in a counties percentage of the State total in any category were fewer in 1991. The effects of the 1990 freeze on San Joaquin Valley counties can be seen in the following changes:

- ! Fresno's and Tulare's share of all commodities dropped by nearly one percent.
- ! In fruits and nuts, the share held by the three major San Joaquin Valley counties (Fresno, Tulare and Kern) dropped 6.5 percent to 35.4 percent of the State's total.
- ! Monterey County maintained its lead in vegetables and increased its share slightly to 23.7 percent of the State total.
- ! San Diego County increased its share of the flower and nursery industry to 26.7 percent, more than the next three counties (Los Angeles, San Mateo and Orange) combined.
- ! Fruits, nuts and vegetables together moved very close to one-half (49.1 percent) of the total value of all agricultural products in California.

There were eight counties in 1991 whose total value of production exceeded one billion dollars. Fresno remains the leader with \$2.6 billion followed by Tulare, Kern, Monterey and Stanislaus. Completing the top ten list were: Riverside, Merced, San Diego, Imperial and Ventura. Few changes were recorded in the ranking of the top five counties within crop groups. Most notable was the entry of Santa Barbara into the top five vegetable counties and Monterey climbing into the five highest producers of nursery products, flowers and foliage. Tulare's leadership in livestock products (especially milk) has lifted it to the top of the all livestock, poultry and apiary category.

NOTES TO THE AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONER DATA

The gross value of production published in this report includes all farm production whether sold into usual marketing channels or used on the farm where produced. Values placed on pasture and range feed are included, and fresh fruit and vegetable crop values are based on the free on board (f.o.b.) packed price. Values are recorded for all products grown during the calendar year regardless of when they are marketed. The County Agricultural Commissioners' Reports also provide statistics on a broader range of commodities than estimates prepared by other agencies.

Because of these concepts, the State total for gross dollar values summarized here differs from the cash receipts to farmers estimated by the California Agricultural Statistics Service. The larger total value reported by the Agricultural Commissioners results from the different definitions that are used in estimating total value of production rather than cash receipts to producers.

Some counties are now including timber as a part of their crop report, following the pattern set by the County Agricultural Commissioners' Association. Since it is not comparable to earlier county summaries, this has not been made a part of the main tables of this summary. The total value reported by the counties including timber is 3.3 percent greater than the \$21.2 billion recorded on page 5 in this bulletin and totals with and without timber are shown on page 1.

Top Ten Crops (Pages 10-12)

These are reported as listed in the crop reports. If no ranking was published, the county is not included in this table.
