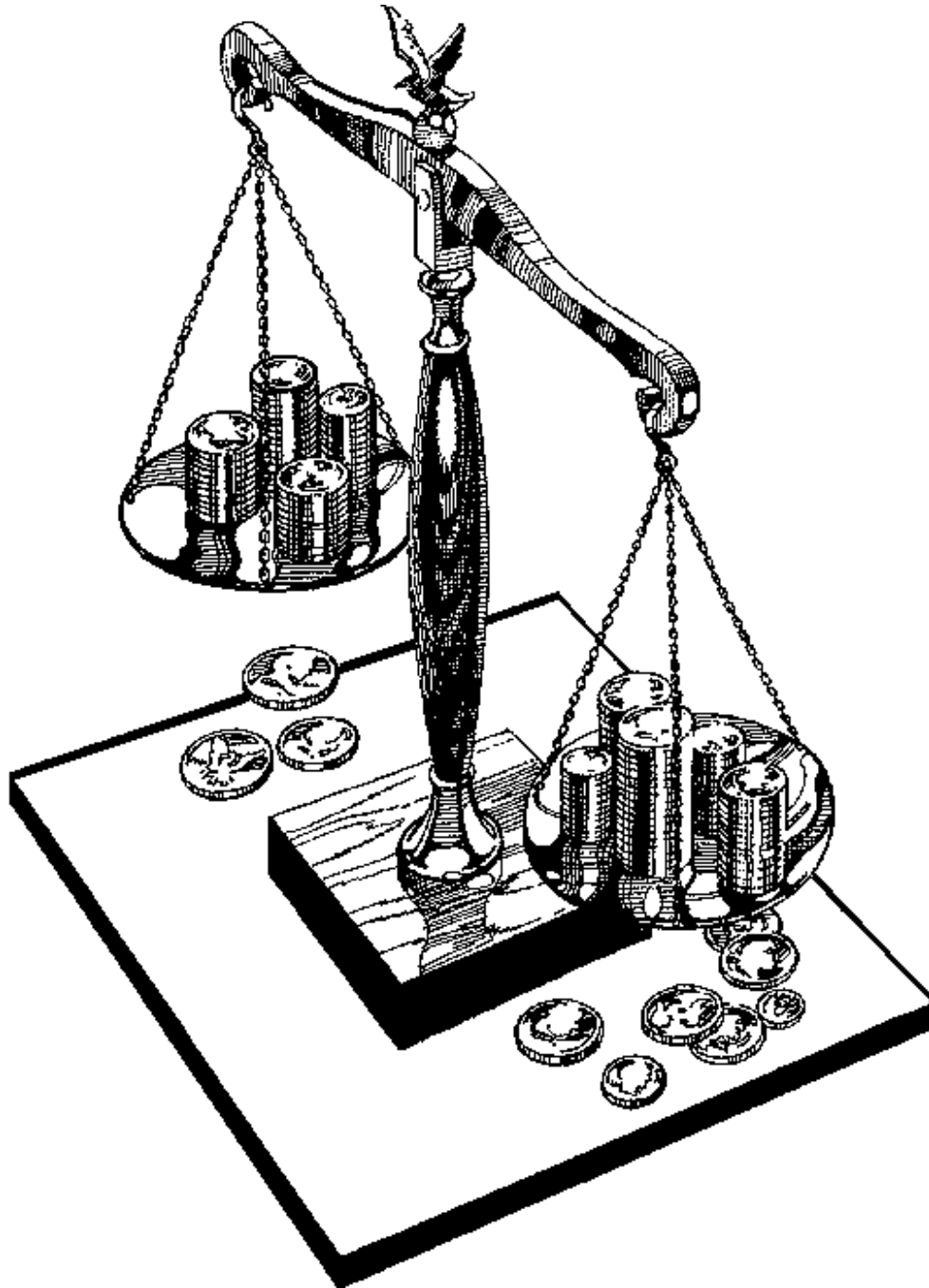

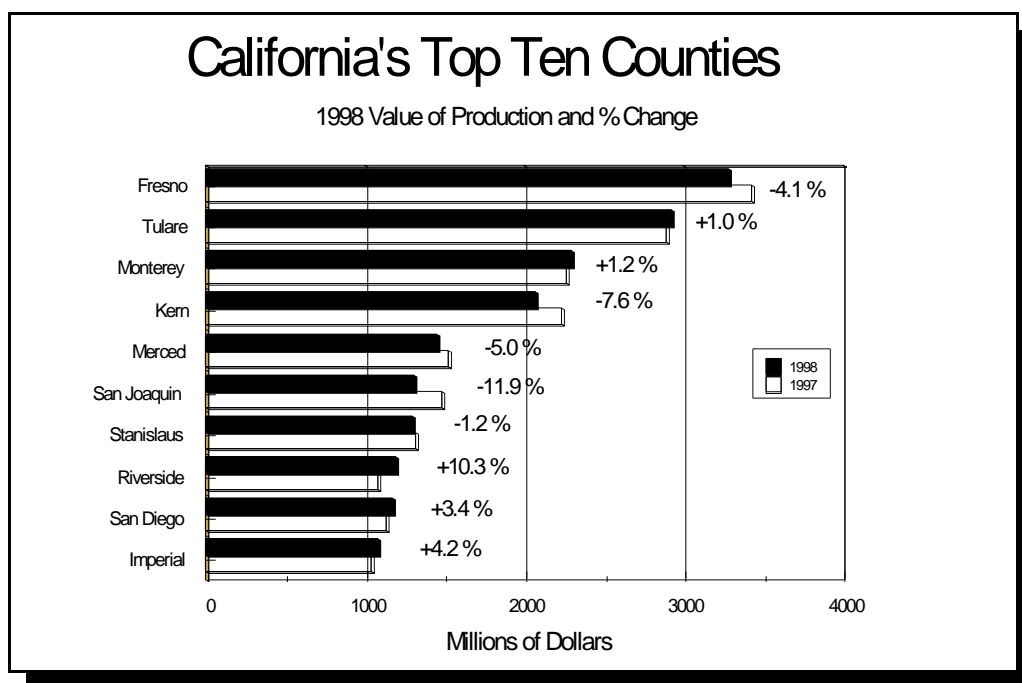

SUMMARY

California's counties reported a drop of 3.9 percent in the value of their agricultural production for 1998. Ten of the top counties submitted values of production in excess of 1.08 billion dollars. Fresno County retained the number one spot with a value of production of 3.29 billion dollars, 4.1 percent lower than the previous year.

Notable Changes in County Rankings and Percentages of the State Total:

Milk	-- Tulare number one with one-fifth of total
Grapes, All	-- Fresno number one with 18 percent of total
Nursery Products	-- San Diego with 18 percent of total
Cattle & Calves	-- Tulare number one and increasing
Lettuce	-- Monterey with more than five of every ten dollars
Oranges	-- Tulare number one with almost half of total
Almonds	-- Stanislaus is number one followed by Kern and Fresno
Flowers & Foliage	-- San Diego dominates with more than half of the total
Alfalfa Hay	-- Imperial number one with 17 percent
Strawberries	-- Monterey holding at number one with Ventura second
Cotton	-- Fresno with more than 41 percent of the total
Tomatoes, Processing	-- Fresno with more than one-third of the total
Broccoli	-- Monterey number one with more than half
Rice (excluding seed)	-- Colusa number one with Sutter nearby
Peaches, All	-- Fresno number one with 37 percent of the total



NOTES TO THE AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONER'S DATA

The gross value of production published in this report includes all farm production whether sold into usual marketing channels or used on the farm where produced. Values placed on pasture and range feed are included, and fresh fruit and vegetable crop values are based on the free on board (f.o.b.) packed price. Values are recorded for all products grown during the calendar year regardless of when they are marketed. The County Agricultural Commissioners' Reports also provide statistics on a broader range of commodities than estimates prepared by other agencies.

Because of these concepts, the State total for gross dollar values summarized here differs from the cash receipts to farmers estimated by the California Agricultural Statistics Service. The larger total value reported by the Agricultural Commissioners results from the different definitions that are used in estimating total value of production rather than cash receipts to producers.

Some counties are now including timber as a part of their crop report, following the pattern set by the County Agricultural Commissioners' Association. Since it is not comparable to earlier county summaries, this has not been made a part of the main tables of this summary. The total value reported by the counties including timber is 3 percent greater than the \$26.9 billion recorded in the "Gross Value of Agricultural Production in California, by County and Commodity Group, 1997-98" table on page 7, and totals with and without timber are shown in the "California Counties Ranked by Gross Value of Agricultural Production, 1998" table on page 3.
