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#### **CATTLE ON FEED IN CALIFORNIA**

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter in California feedlots totaled 530 thousand head on April 1, 2007, unchanged from last month, but 1 percent below April 2006. During March, placements of 68.0 thousand were 15 percent above the previous year. Marketings of 65.0 thousand head were 4 percent below March of 2006. Other disappearance totaled 3.00 thousand head.

#### **U.S. CATTLE ON FEED DOWN 1 PERCENT**

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.6 million head on April 1, 2007. The inventory was 1 percent below April 1, 2006, but 7 percent above April 1, 2005. This is the second highest April 1 inventory since the series began in 1996. The inventory included 7.43 million steers and steer calves, down 4 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 64 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 4.14 million head, up 4 percent from 2006. Placements in feedlots during March totaled 1.97 million, 7 percent above 2006 and 12 percent above 2005. Net placements were 1.89 million. During March, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 350 thousand, 600-699 pounds were 375 thousand, 700-799 pounds were 640 thousand, and 800 pounds and greater were 600 thousand. Marketings of fed cattle during March totaled 1.85 million, 6 percent below both 2006 and 2005. Other disappearance totaled 72.0 thousand during March, 20 percent below 2006, but 6 percent above 2005.

### **CALIFORNIA MILK PRODUCTION**

California milk producers produced 3.55 billion pounds of milk in March 2007. This was 13 percent above February 2007 and 3 percent above March 2006.

Monthly milk per cow averaged 1,975 pounds, 220 pounds more than in February 2007 and 50 pounds more than a year ago.

#### **U.S. HOG INVENTORY UP 1 PERCENT**

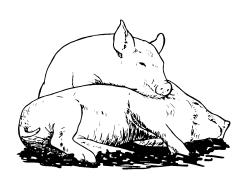
U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on March 1, 2007 was 61.1 million head. This was up 1 percent from March 1, 2006, but down 2 percent from December 1, 2006.

Breeding inventory, at 6.08 million head, was up 1 percent from last year, but down slightly from the previous quarter. Market hog inventory, at 55.0 million head, was up 1 percent from last year, but down 2 percent from last quarter.

The December 2006-February 2007 pig crop, at 26.1 million head, was up 2 percent from 2006 and up 3 percent from 2005. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.87 million head, up 1 percent from both 2006 and 2005. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 47 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.08 for the December 2006-February 2007 period, compared to 9.03 last year. Pigs saved per litter by size of operation ranged from 7.60 for operations with 1-99 hogs and pigs to 9.20 for operations with more than 5.00 thousand hogs and pigs.

### **CALIFORNIA COMMERCIAL SLAUGHTER**

California's production of red meat during March 2007 totaled 142 million pounds (dressed weight), 8 percent above the previous month, but fractionally below March 2006. This figure includes slaughter in Federally-inspected and State-inspected plants, but excludes slaughter done on farms. In March 2007, the average live weight of cattle slaughtered was 1,340 pounds; calves 135 pounds; and hogs 244 pounds.

#### U.S. RED MEAT PRODUCTION UP FROM PREVIOUS MONTH

Commercial red meat production for the United States totaled 4.01 billion pounds in March, down 2 percent from the 4.11 billion pounds produced in March 2006.

Beef production, at 2.12 billion pounds, was 4 percent below the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 2.79 million head, down 2 percent from March 2006. The average live weight was down 10 pounds from the previous year to 1,259 pounds.

Veal production totaled 13.5 million pounds, 7 percent above March a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 70.8 thousand head, up 20 percent from March 2006. The average live weight, at 321 pounds, was down 38 pounds from last year.

Pork production totaled 1.86 billion pounds, down 1 percent from the previous year. Hog kill totaled 9.20 million head, down slightly from March 2006. The average live weight was 270 pounds, down 1 pound from the previous year.

Lamb and mutton production, at 19.6 million pounds, was up 7 percent from March 2006. Sheep slaughter totaled 279 thousand head, 12 percent above last year. The average live weight was 140 pounds, down 5 pounds from March a year ago.

January to March 2007 commercial red meat production was 11.7 billion pounds, up 2 percent from 2006. Accumulated beef production was up 3 percent from last year, veal was up 11 percent, pork was up 1 percent, but lamb and mutton production was down slightly.

March 2006 contained 23 weekdays (including no holidays) and four Saturdays, while March 2007 contained 22 weekdays (including no holidays) and five Saturdays.
