
California Processing Tomato Report

CALIFORNIA PROCESSING TOMATO CONTRACT TONNAGE DOWN 8 PERCENT

California tomato processors have contracted 9.7 million tons of tomatoes for 1997 harvest, 8 percent less than last year's final contracted production. Acreage contracted, at 270 thousand acres, is down 14 percent from last year.

During the past three years, for which an early season processing tomato report has been available, June 1 indication versus the final delivered contracted production was as follows:

Following an extremely wet January, late winter and early spring were among the driest in the history of California. Dry weather has enhanced crop prospects in the Central Valley. The desert harvest is expected to start in early June, while most of the San Joaquin Valley should start the end of June and work its way to the north.

This early processing tomato survey is funded by the California League of Food Processors in cooperation with the California Department of Food and Agriculture. The USDA estimate for all states will be issued on July 10.
