


## TOMATO PROCESSORS EXPECT TO CONTRACT 10 MILLION TONS IN 1998

As of January 15, 1998, California tomato processors reported intentions to contract 10.0 million tons of processing tomatoes from 288 thousand acres. This intended acreage is 8 percent above 1997, but 9 percent below 1996. During the past four years, intentions versus final delivered contracted production were as follows:

Ground preparation, fumigation, and weed control activities for the 1998 crop progressed much better than 1997.

This early processing tomato contract intentions estimate was funded by the California League of Food Processors in cooperation with the California Department of Food and Agriculture. The USDA processing intentions estimate for all states will be issued on April 9.
