11/10 Finding Family: Using eVetRecs

The National Archives is the official repository for records of military personnel who have been discharged from the U.S. Air Force, Army, Marine Corps, Navy, and Coast Guard. Military personnel records can be used as a valuable tool in genealogical research. Most veterans and their next-of-kin can obtain free copies of their DD Form 214 (Report of Separation) and other military and medical records using eVetRecs.

12/9 Finding Family: Using Court Records

Was grandma a bootlegger? Did grandpa pay his taxes? Records from Federal courts are among the National Archives' largest holdings. The records cover topics ranging from land ownership, slavery, taxation, and immigration. We will discuss these court records and how you can access this important resource.
