## **Brief Synopsis of Interpretive Programs:**

"Greek Revival in the New World" – ranger-led tour of architectural highlights of the 1842 Customs House.

"Alexander Hamilton and the Foundation of the US Army" – discover how Hamilton's military service in the American Revolution laid the groundwork for the current U. S. military system and the establishment of the Revenue Cutter service. Representatives from U.S. Army and U.S. Coast Guard will also be on hand.

"Into the National Archives Vaults" – tour a new preview exhibit and see the original New York Ratification of the Bill of Rights document.

"A Pox on You" – costumed demonstration using the medical history of George Washington as an outline to discuss the medical and surgical procedures of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. Program includes a display of period medical instruments and surgical techniques.

"The Printing Press: A Weapon of Revolution" – costumed discussion of the role the free press played in fanning the flames of the American Revolution. Program includes a practical demonstration of a reproduction 18<sup>th</sup>-century printing press.
