



Bo Derek 2008 Mistress of Ceremonies

This year, we are honored to welcome Hollywood and TV star, published author and true humanitarian Bo Derek, as Mistress of Ceremonies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival stage show. No stranger to the event, Derek has attended the Festival many times in the past, enjoying the artistic talents of both our visual and performing artists.

Running on the beach in the 1979 smash hit "10," Bo Derek entered American pop culture and became the standard for the "perfect 10 beauty." Nearly 30 years later, she proves that real beauty goes even deeper, devoting her time to caring for other people and animals alike.

Her concern for animals led Derek to create *Bless the Beasts*, a line of pet products sold in stores nationwide. She donates a portion of all sales to *Canine Companions for Independence*, a non-profit organization that

to Canine Companions for Independence, a non-profit organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing them with highly trained assistance dogs and



Her strong compassion for people with disabilities goes even further. For eight years, Derek has served as the national honorary chairperson for the Department of Veterans Affairs' National Rehabilitation Special Events. These annual therapeutic and rehabilitative events are designed to help veterans overcome their disabilities through competition. They are the hallmark of rehabilitation programs in the nation.

Born Mary Cathleen Collins in Long Beach, Calif., Bo Derek is no stranger to veterans. Her father, Paul Collins, was a radio operator during the Korean War. Both her stepfather and her late husband, John Derek, were also veterans. It is this love for the armed forces that has inspired her to meet and encourage America's veterans one by one.

In 2002, Derek was bestowed by the Special Forces Association with the distinction of honorary Green Beret, joining only four other Americans who have been so honored. She was recognized for her efforts on behalf of America's men and women in uniform and our military veterans. She participates in USO tours, entertaining U.S. military personnel serving abroad.

More recently, she was appointed as Special Envoy of the Secretary of State for Wildlife Trafficking, working to create awareness of the dangers of wildlife trafficking. Along with her love of animals and devotion to veterans, Derek is also a patron of the arts. In 2002, President George W. Bush appointed her to the Kennedy Center Board of Trustees. In 2006, she starred on My Network TV's breakthrough drama, *Fashion House*.

A published author, Derek poured into *Riding Lessons: Everything That Matters in Life I Learned from Horses* the essence of her beauty – a radiance that comes from her caring heart and bright mind. Despite the years that have passed since she first seared the American consciousness with her image, Bo Derek is as captivating and as ravishingly beautiful as ever – both inside and out. It is our great pleasure to welcome her as Mistress of Ceremonies at this year's event.

A Special Tribute

Jane Powell 2008 Diamond Award Recipient

Jane Powell served as the Mistress of Ceremonies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival stage show a total of nine times. In 1991, she graciously accepted the role of emcee and returned nearly every year from 1999 through 2007. Over the years, her enthusiastic willingness to lend her time and talents has contributed greatly toward increasing public awareness and success of the Creative Arts Festival.

Powell's strong volunteer spirit and the love for veterans she has shown through the years made her an ideal candidate for the prestigious Secretary's Diamond Award. This special award acknowledges her outstanding contribution to veterans and was presented to her in October 2008 by the Honorable James B. Peake, Secretary of Veterans Affairs.



At the young age of 14, Jane Powell came to Hollywood from Portland, Oregon, where she had her own radio shows and served as the Oregon Victory Girl, selling war bonds during World War II. After winning a talent contest, she was given an MGM contract and starred in 20 major musicals including *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers* and *Royal Wedding*, co-starring Fred Astaire. Many of the songs she introduced became industry standards.

Starring in every entertainment medium, Powell has appeared on Broadway in *Irene* and repeatedly set attendance records in dozens of touring productions including *My Fair Lady, Peter Pan* and *The Sound of Music*. She has demonstrated an extraordinary flair for comedy in such non-musical successes as *Chapter Two, Marriage-Go-Round*, and *Same Time, Next Year*, for which she won a Drama-Logue Award. In 2000, she won considerable acclaim for her performance in the New York production of *Avow*, was featured in a Showtime original TV movie, *The Sandy Bottom Orchestra*, and won acclaim for her portrayal of an Alzheimer's victim in *Law and Order, SVU*. More recently, she co-starred in the Stephen Sondheim musical, *Bounce*.

Television audiences have seen Jane Powell in guest-starring roles in leading variety shows, popular series and numerous Academy Awards and television specials. She appeared regularly in the TV series *Growing Pains*, and in several daytime dramas. She has performed for five U.S. Presidents as well as the Queen of England.

Powell's autobiography, *The Girl Next Door and How She Grew*, was published by William Morrow and (in paperback) by Berkley. Her exercise video, *Fight Back with Fitness*, designed to help people with arthritis, was produced in conjunction with The Arthritis Foundation. On the lecture circuit, her subjects include fitness, renewal and growth in the golden years, and her life in Hollywood.

Powell lives in Connecticut with her husband Dick Moore, and enjoys gardening and cooking. She has three grown children and two granddaughters.

History of the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival

The National Veterans Creative Arts Festival originated as two separate competitions. Muriel Barbour, then chief of recreation therapy at the McGuire VA Medical Center in Richmond, Va., created the visual arts competition, VET ARTS, in 1981, as an observance of the International Year of Disabled Persons. Shirley Jefferies, a recreation therapist at the Waco, Texas, VA Medical Center, initiated the performing arts competition, The National Music Competition for Veterans, in 1981. The premier live winners' stage show was held in 1981 at the VA Medical Center in Tuskegee, Ala. The second show was staged in 1982 at the Coatesville, Pa., VA Medical Center.

In 1984, the live stage show was presented in Washington, D.C., and the music competition was renamed "The Music Festival." The following year, the stage show took place in historic Constitution Hall.

The Music Festival and VET ARTS merged and drama and dance divisions were added, to create the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival in 1989. Designed to spotlight the four creative arts therapies of art, music, dance and drama, this landmark Festival was performed to an audience of 4,000 in the Fox Theater in St. Louis, Mo. In 2005, a fifth creative arts division, creative writing, was added to the Festival roster.

The National Veterans Creative Arts Festival continues to evolve each year as it showcases the artistic achievements of veterans from across the country in each of the five artistic divisions. Each Festival features an art exhibit showing the first place artwork from 52 categories. A live stage show, complete with orchestral accompaniment generously provided by the Music Performance Fund, is performed by veterans who have achieved medal-winning status in a variety of categories from the performing arts divisions of music, drama and dance, as well as creative writing. Workshops are offered during the Festival week for participants and staff, educating them in a variety of artistic modalities by utilizing the talents of local community artists. There is no competition at the Festival itself, as it is a showcase for previously judged medal winners.


In 2008, more than 3000 veterans from 113 VA medical facilities entered the art, music, drama, dance and creative writing competitions. Of those, approximately 140 medal-winning veterans earned an invitation to participate in the 2008 Festival. This year, the event takes place October 20-26 in Riverside, California, hosted by the VA Loma Linda Healthcare System. The art exhibit and stage show performance will be held at the Riverside Convention Center on Sunday, October 26, 2008.

The Department of Veterans Affairs, Help Hospitalized Veterans and the American Legion Auxiliary present the 2008 National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, and it is also supported by many other organizations both locally and nationally. The staff and volunteers of the VA Loma Linda Healthcare System take great pride in welcoming the 2008 Festival participants and their guests.

2008 Festival Host: VA Loma Linda Healthcare System

The VA Loma Linda Healthcare System (VALLHCS) is one of the top 50 employers in the Inland Empire, with 2,268 employees and 1,257 volunteers serving the 59,000 area veterans who entrust their health care needs to VA. In 2007, the medical center served 5,137 women veterans, and had a total of 510,640 outpatient visits and 8,559 inpatient stays.

The VA Loma Linda Healthcare System includes the Jerry L. Pettis Memorial VA Medical Center, which opened in 1977 and is located in Loma Linda, California. The medical center is named in memory of Congressman Jerry L. Pettis, who worked diligently to locate the facility in Loma Linda. The major bed services include medicine, surgery, behavioral medicine and neurology. The facility has 142 hospital beds and a 108 bed community living center.



Enhancing access to VA care, the medical center also operates five community clinics, in partnership with its affiliate, Loma Linda University Medical Center and Loma Linda University Health Care. The clinics are located in Corona, Palm Desert, Sun City, Upland and Victorville.



The medical center is teamed up with 71 other education institutions and provides training for a variety of allied health specialists. The facility also operates an active research program, with 64 principle investigators who support more than 148 research projects in all major areas of medicine and surgery, particularly musculoskeletal disease, molecular genetics, chronic heart failure, molecular cytology and connective tissue disease.

The staff and volunteers of the VALLHCS are proud to serve the men and women of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom. A special team of individuals at the medical center assists those veterans in the transition from military to civilian life. To date, the team has proudly seen more than 4,000 recently discharged combat veterans.

VALLHCS is part of the VA Desert Pacific Healthcare Network. Each of the network's five facilities has adopted the Planetree Model offering cultural transformation in the health care setting. With Planetree, an environment is created that cultivates healing of the mind, body and spirit. It is patient-directed, value-based, holistic and supports the safety of patients through active involvement in their own care. The VA Loma Linda Healthcare System is beginning this transition by enhancing its community living center, to provide the veteran residents with a more welcoming and homelike environment.



2008 Festival Host City: About the Area



Welcome to California, the Golden State! The natural beauty, exciting theme parks, spectacular weather, diverse population and vast array of outdoor sports are a trademark of this beautiful state. California's natural features include beaches, deserts, forests and mountains, all reachable within a short drive. The center of California is dominated by the central valley, one of the most productive agricultural areas in the world.

California's history is one full of dreams. The journey to California to chase those dreams landed in mixed results at times, but many have made their dreams come true here. One of those dreams was the California Gold Rush. It began in January 1848, when a work crew camped on the American River at Coloma near Sacramento and discovered a few tiny gold nuggets. Thus began one of the largest human migrations in history as a half-million people from around the world descended upon California in search of instant wealth. The Gold Rush led to the development of railroads and a mining industry that continued for more than one hundred years.

Of course there is also the common dream of becoming a true Hollywood star. As early as the 1900s, young men and women sought their fame and fortune in Hollywood's movie industry. As filmmaking took off, Hollywood hosted the first Academy Awards Ceremony in 1929, celebrating the industry's accomplishments. In 1958, the Hollywood Walk of Fame was created as a tribute to artists working in the entertainment industry. Today, being a Hollywood star is still the dream of many people across the nation – and the world – and entertainment continues to be a thriving industry for California.

Calling California Home

California is home to a variety of sports teams consisting of three national football teams, four national basketball teams, three national hockey teams, five major league baseball teams and three major league soccer teams. It also has the honor of having hosted three Olympic Games.

In addition, California is the home to the main therapeutic arts distribution center for Help Hospitalized Veterans (HHV). The organization's headquarters are located in Winchester, where HHV employees package and distribute art and craft kits for veterans to use in their rehabilitation treatment at VA and military hospitals worldwide. Since 1991, HHV has been a proud sponsor of the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival.

2008 Festival Host City: About the Area

Riverside, California

The city is named for the nearby Santa Ana River and is the birthplace of the California citrus industry. Postcards of lush orange groves, swimming pools and magnificent homes have attracted vacationers and entrepreneurs throughout the years. Many have relocated to the warm, dry climate for reasons of health and to escape the harsh winters elsewhere.


The first orange trees of Riverside were planted in 1871. The trees thrived in the southern California climate and the navel orange industry grew rapidly, leading to a California Gold Rush of a different kind – the establishment of the citrus industry. By 1882, there were more than half a million citrus trees in California, almost half located in Riverside. Today, the remembrance of the orange industry is strong but most of the trees have disappeared with continuing economic change.



As the city prospered, a small guest hotel designed in the popular Mission revival style and known as the Glenwood Tavern, grew to eventually become the world famous Mission Inn. The Inn was favored by presidents, royalty and movie stars, including Ronald and Nancy Reagan who honeymooned there and Richard and Pat Nixon, who were married on its

grounds. Teddy Roosevelt planted a tree in its courtyard and the Mission Inn still owns a special chair built for President William Howard Taft when he visited there.







Riverside citizens are proud of their city's unique character, born from a tradition of careful planning – from its carefully laid out historic Mile Square to its 1924 Civic Center. The City's Office of Historic Preservation is committed to preserving the past as a firm foundation for the future. More than one hundred city landmarks, 20 national historic register sites and two national landmarks have been designated by the City Council, all offering enjoyment and education to city residents and visitors alike.

A Band of Brothers

CHARLES MARSHALL MARTINSBURG VA MEDICAL CENTER MARTINSBURG, WEST VIRGINIA

In 1998, Charles Marshall, a Vietnam era veteran, had an accident that caused a massive head injury. It paralyzed him for two years. He began using his artistic ability as a means of physical rehabilitation of his legs, arms and hands, and as a form of expression that helped him cope with the psychological effects of his injuries.

After discharge from the Martinsburg VA Medical Center, Marshall joined the Ebenezer Baptist Church, also in Martinsburg. In the winter of 2006, the church broke ground for a new sanctuary. As part of the renovation project, an old walnut tree was being removed and, believing that the tree had a story to tell, Marshall asked if he could be given the tree's center. Wanting to strengthen his lower back, he then started to carve. "I knew that the heart of this tree was going to challenge me, and greatly test my faith and ability to put my mind to work," he said. "After deep prayer, I thought about what God had laid in my heart. I knew that the title would be, *A Band of Brothers*."



After a year of painstaking work, the sculpture was completed. Marshall describes what the faces in his project represent. "The praying man depicts that it was only through prayer and hard work that I have come this far. Going through life blindly, we need the spirit of God to lead and guide us and that is what the blind man represents. The wise man epitomizes that only the word of God can make us wise, and the fisherman shows us that God wants us all to be fishers of men."

Passages: Time to Break Free from PTSD

Creating a work of art is a journey toward healing for Army veteran Pamela "Jade" Scott. Faced with the challenges of Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), she discovered through art an avenue to redirect her feelings toward peace of mind. According to Scott, her most recent creation, *Passages: Time to Break Free from PTSD* represents "my deepest desire to live a normal life despite the effects of PTSD."

Scott has discovered that working predominately with clay to create masks reflects "an evolution in transformation." Another of her creations, entitled *Celtic Warrior - The Power of the Mask*, won first place in the 2007 National Veterans Creative Arts Competition.



Scott says, "My passage may not be complete, but it truly is my time to break free from PTSD."

David Gjerdingen devoted nine years of his life to serving his country during the Vietnam War. Serving as an Army operating room technician at an evacuation hospital, he witnessed significant injuries and loss of life from both sides. For Gjerdingen, the emotional and mental toll was devastating.



He says, "For the past several years, I have tried to use the VA art contest as a way to express deep feelings about my experiences. It has been a wonderful outlet for letting my artistic adventures give a face and a form to my fears and challenges."

View from a Tree Line, the digital computer graphic artwork he created, represents that expression of feelings. Gjerdingen felt compelled to write a piece to accompany it.



One to three times each week at the VA Central Iowa Health Care System in Knoxville, four veterans gather to participate in the music therapy program. There are various physical and mental health challenges that exist among the group members, and treatment goals are carefully addressed to meet the needs of each individual.

During the sessions, the veterans work on bell ringing and function as a bell choir, but more recently they expressed an interest in becoming more physically active as a group. Music therapist Suzanne Anderson suggested they try dancing, and work on developing a routine that could be entered into the National Veterans Creative Arts competition. The veterans enthusiastically agreed and set out to develop a dance routine to the spirited song, *Ragg Mopp*, using mops as props for purposes of entertainment as well as to assist with physical balance. Wheelchairs and scooters were abandoned in order to challenge themselves in new and mobility-creative ways.

The outcomes for the veterans known as *The Knoxville Dancing Vets* have been only positive. They have experienced a sense of satisfaction at the accomplishment they have achieved, and have re-established a feeling of cohesiveness within the group. Challenged in a different way, they look forward to continuing to develop more dance routines that reinforce their desire to maintain and improve their physical health and mental well-being.

Have a Happy ORLINDA MARQUEZ VA EASTERN COLORADO HEALTH CARE SYSTEM, DENVER

The use of a puppet for therapeutic purpose is something that Orlinda Marquez does not consider unusual. This Army veteran experiences social anxiety related to Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). A hand puppet known as Henry accompanies Marquez at social gatherings and unfamiliar or crowded places.

Marquez describes how she uses Henry as an alternative therapy, saying, "As I learned more about therapy animals, I discovered that much of what these animals offer to their owners, I get from Henry. In order to cope in crowds I often have to retreat into my own little bubble and ignore my surroundings. When Henry is with me, I'm better able to survive. He is a curiosity and people are drawn to him. He opens up the conversation with a greeting and will converse with people. Eventually, I'll get into the conversation myself and before I know it, I am coping in the crowd and I am no longer among strangers."

Linda Hauck, a social worker who has seen firsthand how Henry has reduced Marquez's anxiety in social situations says, "Henry helps Orlinda deal with her anxiety. He provides some distraction for her as she places the attention on Henry. Her performances always include humor and speak to her creativeness as an artist, while benefitting therapeutically at the same time."

A lifelong Elvis Presley fan, Marquez's performance of *Have a Happy* was inspired by a song from an Elvis Presley film.

Who's Army? DONALD FRENCH VA CENTRAL IOWA HEALTH CARE SYSTEM, KNOXVILLE

Army veteran Donald French has always loved to write stories and interesting anecdotes. He has taken writing classes and has had some of his stories published in his hometown newspaper. An original composition entitled, *Who's Army?* describes a humorous incident that occurred while he was stationed in Germany in 1991. Upon reading his name tag, a civilian mistook him for a French soldier. French's account of the experience received first place in the special recognition category of the 2008 drama division competition.

Writing original compositions has also brought about other benefits. French has difficulty speaking and often stutters when conversing with others, stumbling with words and sentences and feeling anxious. When he reads his compositions aloud though, he stutters very little if at all. He is able to add expression to the stories and gains an unmistakable sense of self-confidence and control.

French's writing and effortless reading of his stories clearly exemplify the therapeutic influence of the arts.

Love Is a Many Splendored Thing PAUL AARONBERG VA MEDICAL CENTER NORTHPORT, NEW YORK

Paul Aaronberg is an Army veteran who served in combat in the Pacific Theatre during World War II. Before entering the service, he sang in a choir at his synagogue and was also hired to sing at local functions. He continued singing after his time in the military, mainly songs by Frank Sinatra and Perry Como.

Though he is now diagnosed with dementia and experiences confusion and difficulty with memory, singing is one thing Aaronberg continues to enjoy. He actively attends music therapy groups one to two times weekly, recalling the lyrics and melodies of songs with little or no cueing. During music therapy sessions, his mood brightens and he becomes interactive and supportive of the other group members.

Through music therapy, Aaronberg benefits from successful treatment outcomes that include memory stimulation and improvement in cognitive functioning, as well as social interaction. In the words of Northport VA music therapist Tracey Enright, "Mr. Aaronberg transcends the disease of dementia when he sings, and during that time he is able to make a positive connection with those around him."



SPECIAL RECOGNITION CATEGORY - GROUP MUSIC DIVISION

Kansas City BAND OF BROTHERS VA OUTPATIENT CLINIC AND CENTER FOR REHABILITATION AND EXTENDED CARE MARTINEZ, CALIFORNIA

Three veterans from very different walks of life met while receiving care at the VA Outpatient Clinic and Center for Rehabilitation and Extended Care in Martinez, California. Each was undergoing treatment for a variety of health issues but they had one thing in common – a desire to connect with others. They did this through music.

Virgil Icban, a Navy veteran of the Vietnam era, was undergoing rehabilitation for bilateral amputation. He had dedicated his personal and professional life to helping the people of his community, by serving as a family support counselor and basketball coach. His point of view is, "Remain strong in your determination and let others know you can achieve your dreams and goals."

George Rowan Jr., (known as "Jack London George"), who served in the Army National Guard from 1962 to 1968, was recovering from a major heart attack and also dealing with Post-traumatic Stress Disorder. While volunteering as a pianist at hospital and community events, Rowan also found time to work on community restoration projects. "I wanted to give back somehow," he said.

The third member of the group is Leo Bailey, a World War II Navy veteran. Bailey lost the fingers of his right hand in a skill saw accident and underwent extensive surgeries to replace his fingers. Despite his physical challenges, Bailey served as a great inspiration to other veterans with his musical talents on the keyboard, harmonica and guitar.

Over the course of the rehabilitation period of these three veterans, recreation therapist Darlyn Phillips observed that they shared a love for music and a strong sense of duty to others. She introduced them and asked if they would like to join together as a musical trio. As a result, *The Band of Brothers* was formed.

Their toe-tapping rendition of the song *Kansas City*, which they entered in the 2008 National Veterans Creative Arts competition, received first place in the special recognition category of the music division, and represents their unique and spirited style.
