# CARES DEMAND MODEL

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## **What does the model do?**

- Projects future veteran enrollment.
- Projects future utilization (inpatient and outpatient).
- Projection years focus on 2013 and 2023.



# DATA SOURCES

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## **Where does the data come from?**

- Milliman U.S.A. (under VA auspices) has provided the enrollment projections.
- The model is run each year to assist the VA Secretary in making an enrollment decision.
- Milliman U.S.A. (under VA auspices) applies private sector utilization rates to the projected enrollment to come up with the future utilization estimates in 25 categories of care.
- Data is projected for the VISN, Cares Market, and Sectors.
- VA Fiscal Year 2003 workload data is used as the baseline.



# DATA CUBES

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## **How are the data organized?**

- For ease in looking at the data, data have been arranged in data cubes.
- Using special software called Proclarity, data can be looked at in several different ways.
- Cubes include: Enrollment, Veteran Population, Utilization by Facility, and Utilization by Market and Sector.



# DATA DIMENSIONS

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## What's in the cubes?

- Data in the cubes have several dimensions or characteristics such as:
  - Treatment Levels (All/VISN/Parent Facility/CBOC)
  - Eligibility by Priority Group, Age, Gender
  - Unit Type (Clinic Stop, Beds, Bed Days of Care)
  - Types of Care (Inpatient, Outpatient, Outpatient Specialized Mental Health, and Prescriptions)



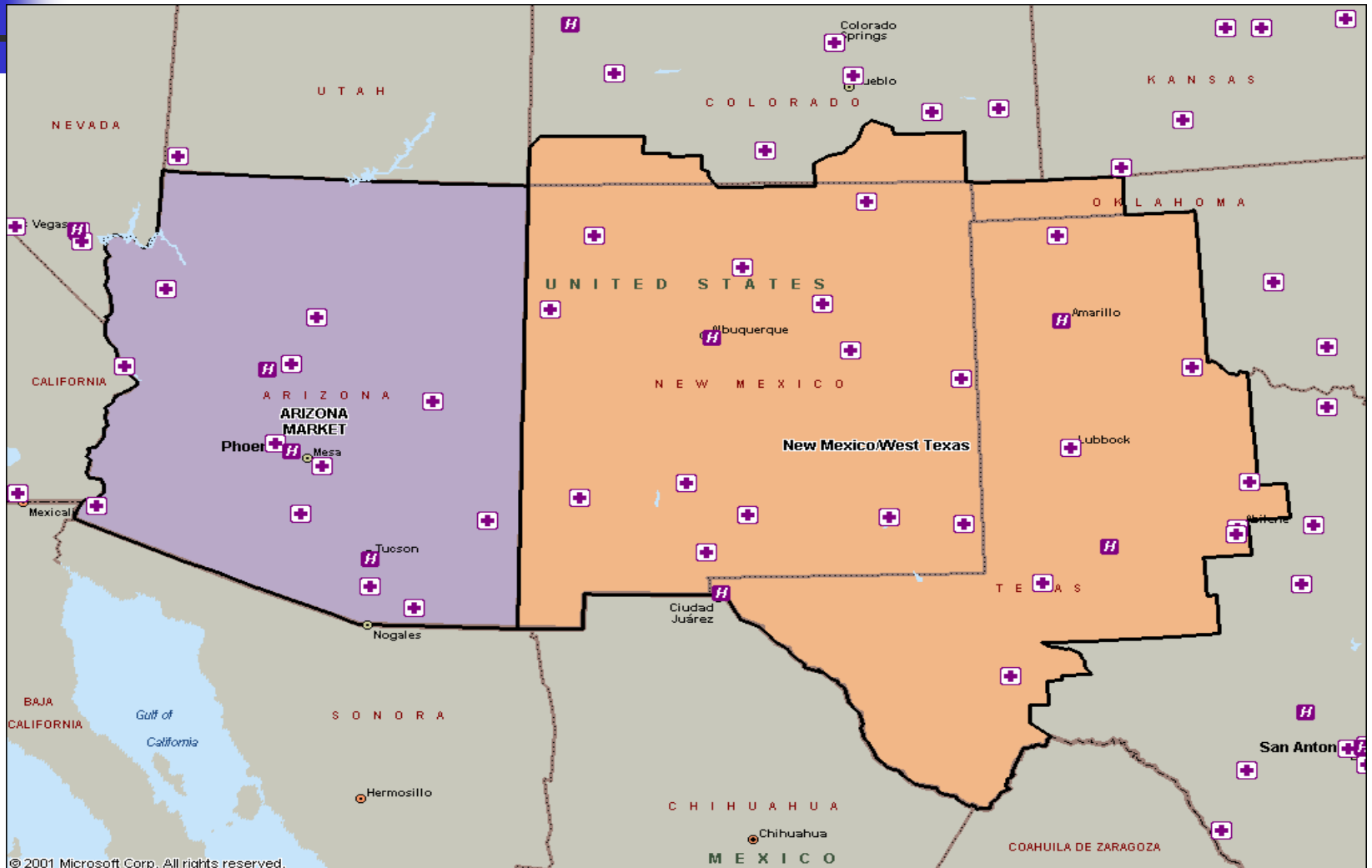

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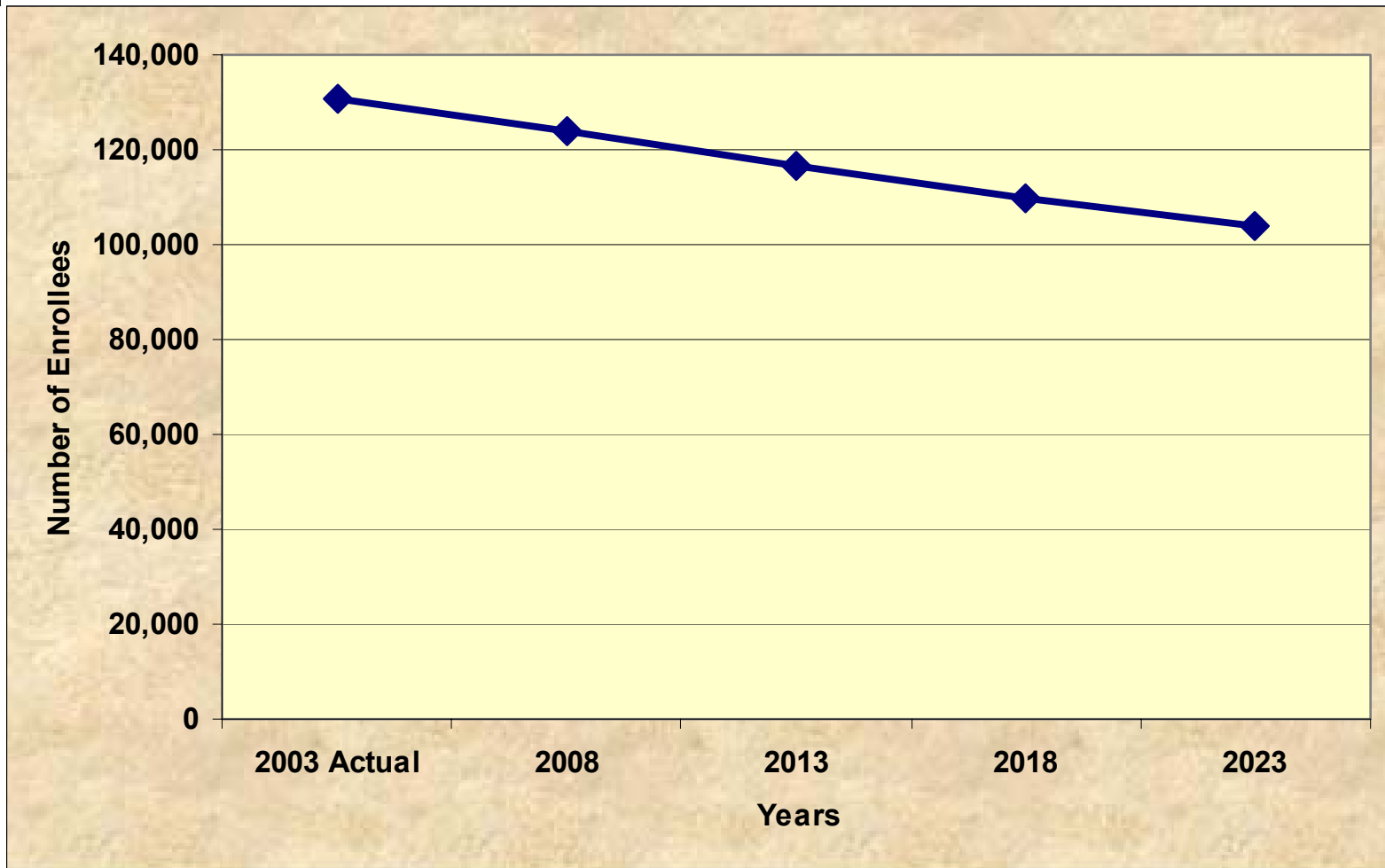

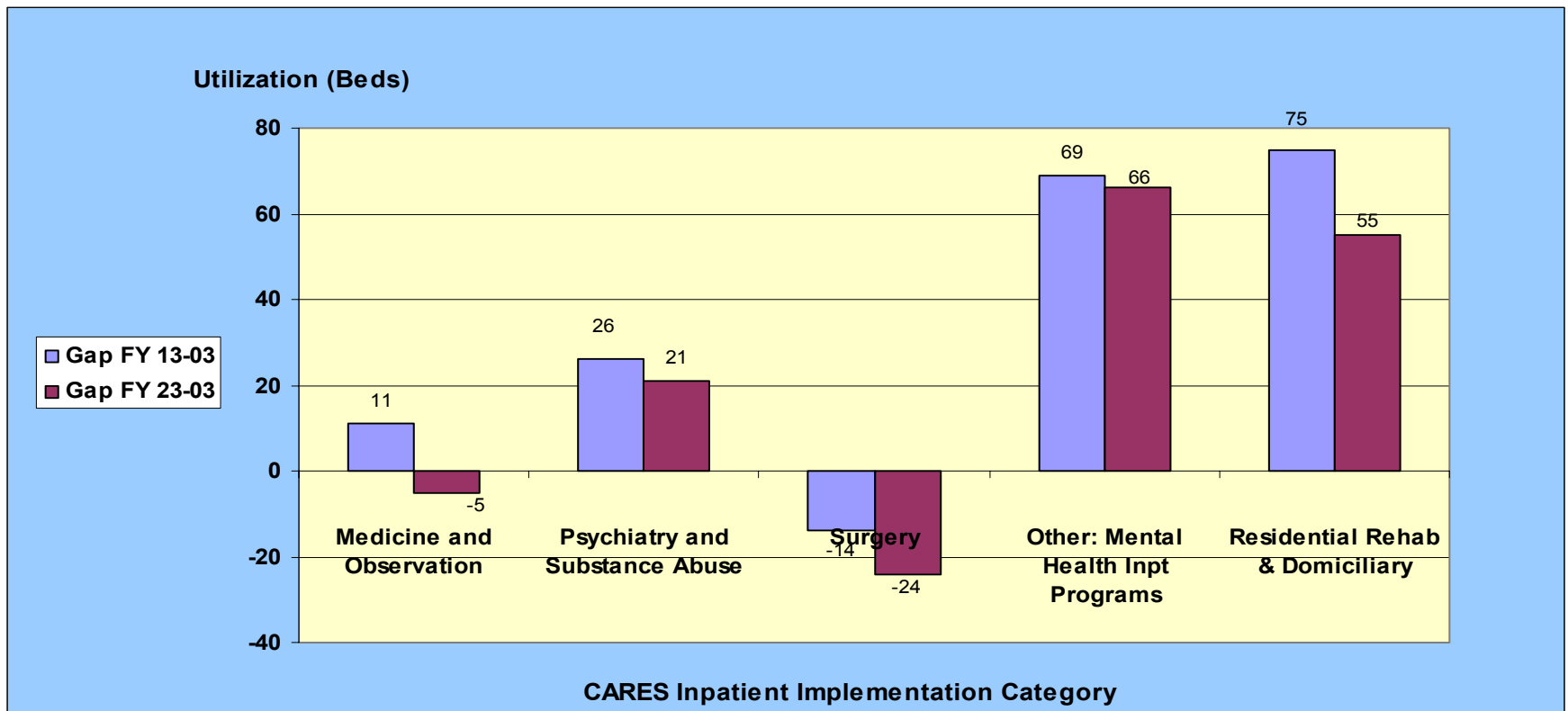


# PROJECTED ENROLLMENT FOR THE NEW MEXICO/WEST TEXAS MARKET

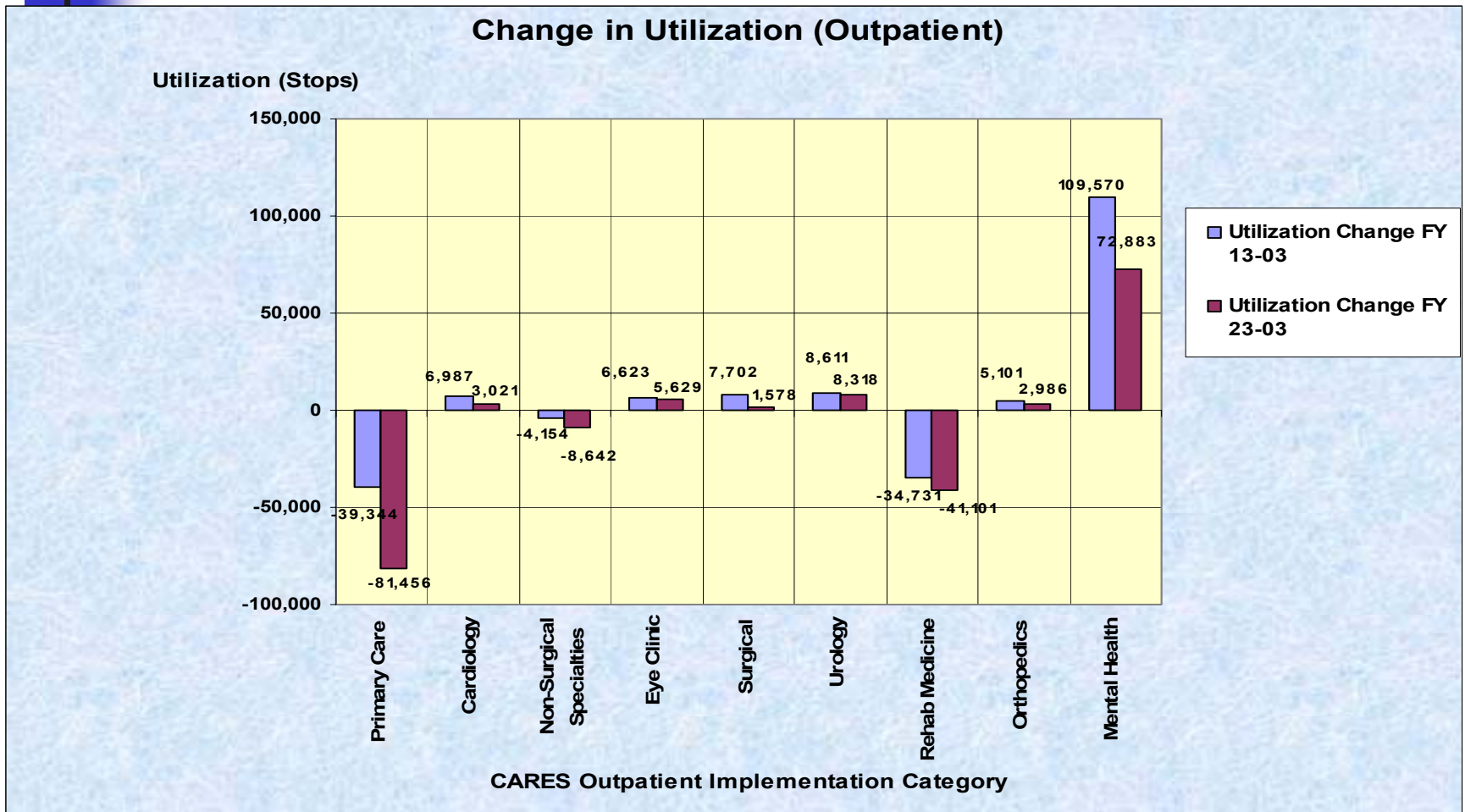




# GAP BEDS - NEW MEXICO/WEST TEXAS MARKET

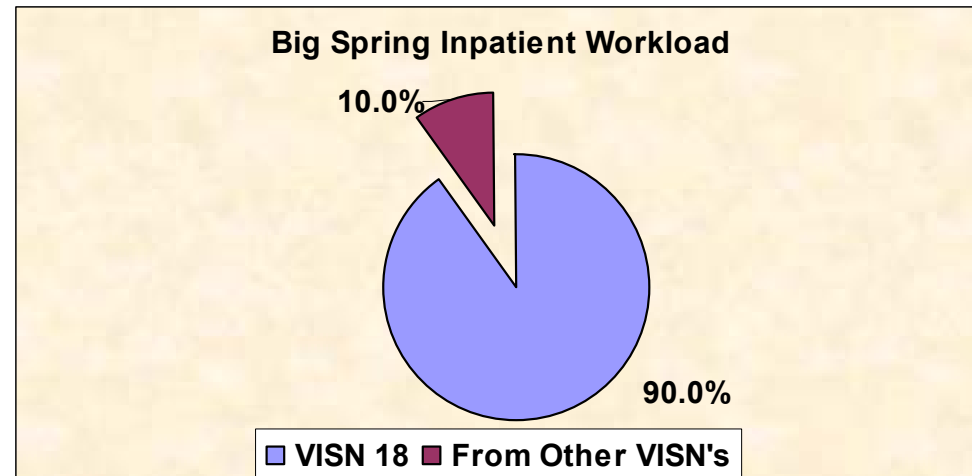
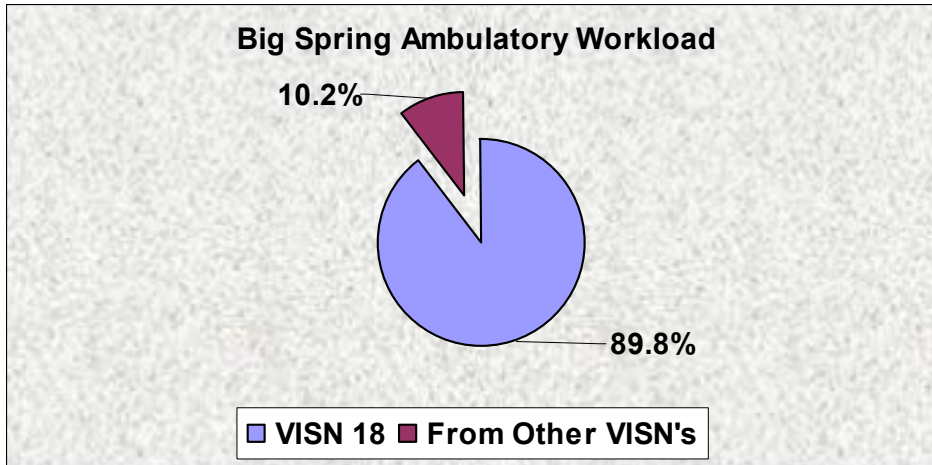


# NEW MEXICO/WEST TEXAS MARKET CHANGES IN OUTPATIENT UTILIZATION

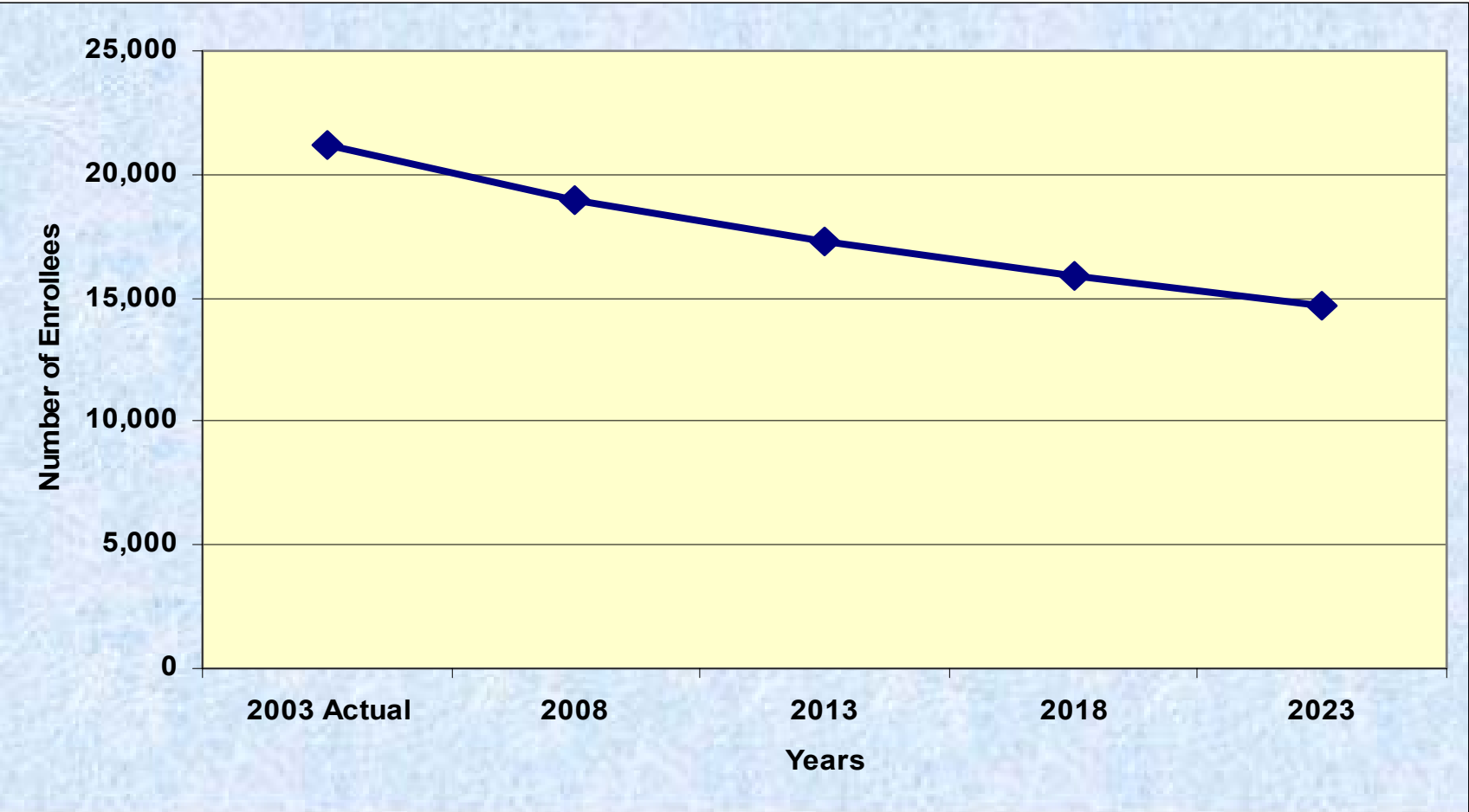




# BIG SPRING WORKLOAD PATIENT ORIGIN

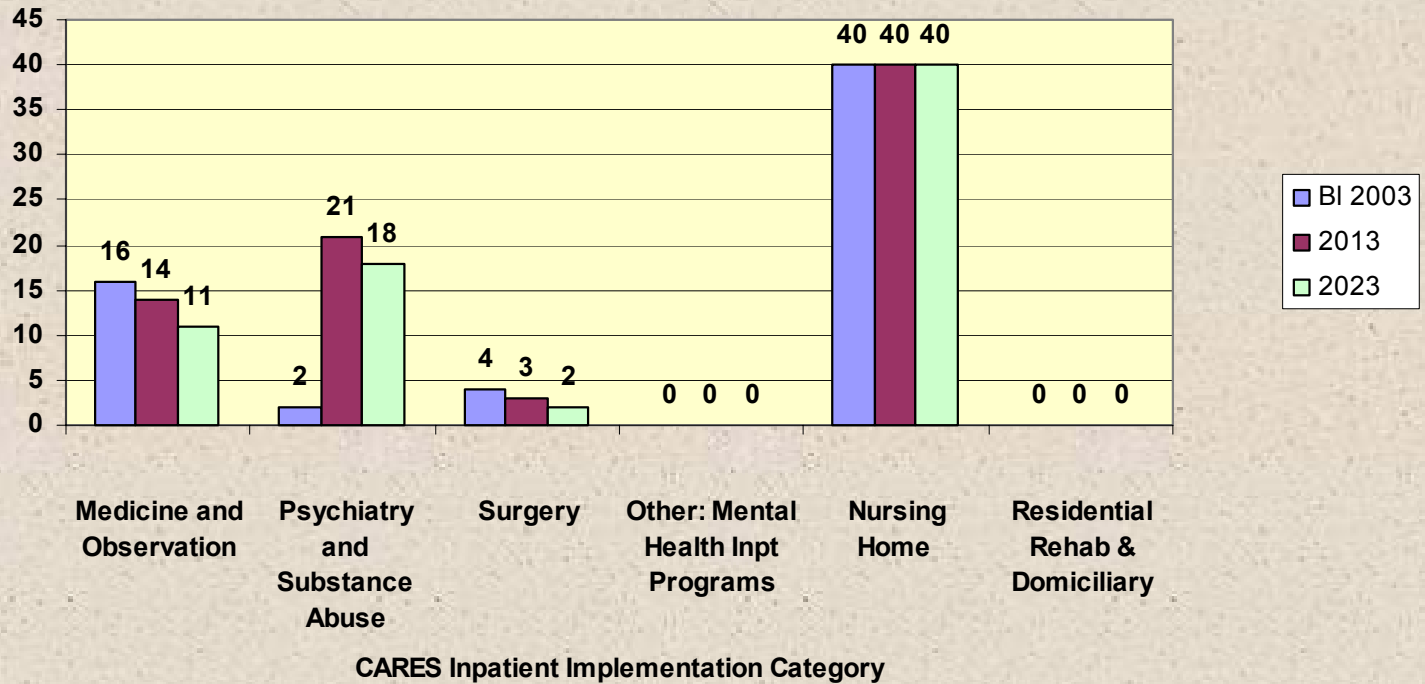


# BIG SPRING FACILITY PROJECTED ENROLLMENT



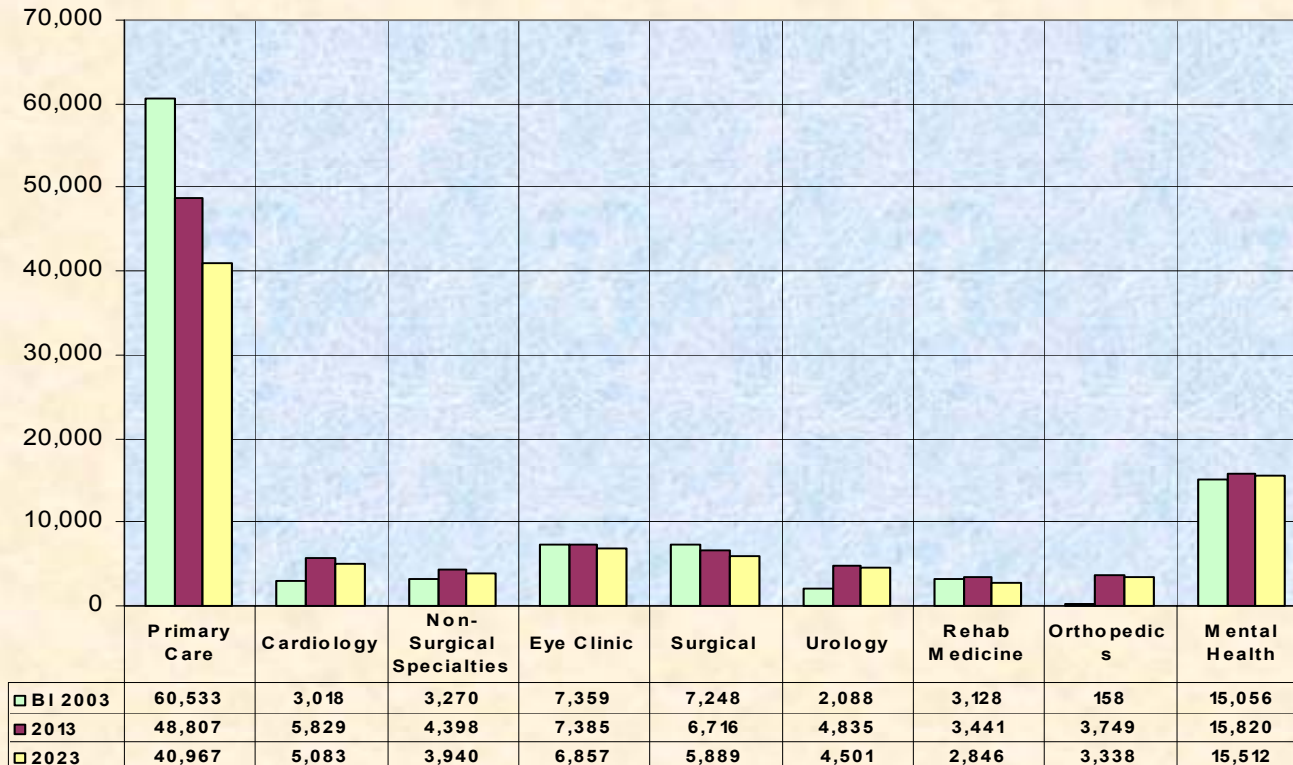
# Big Spring Facility Bed Projections

Utilization (Beds)



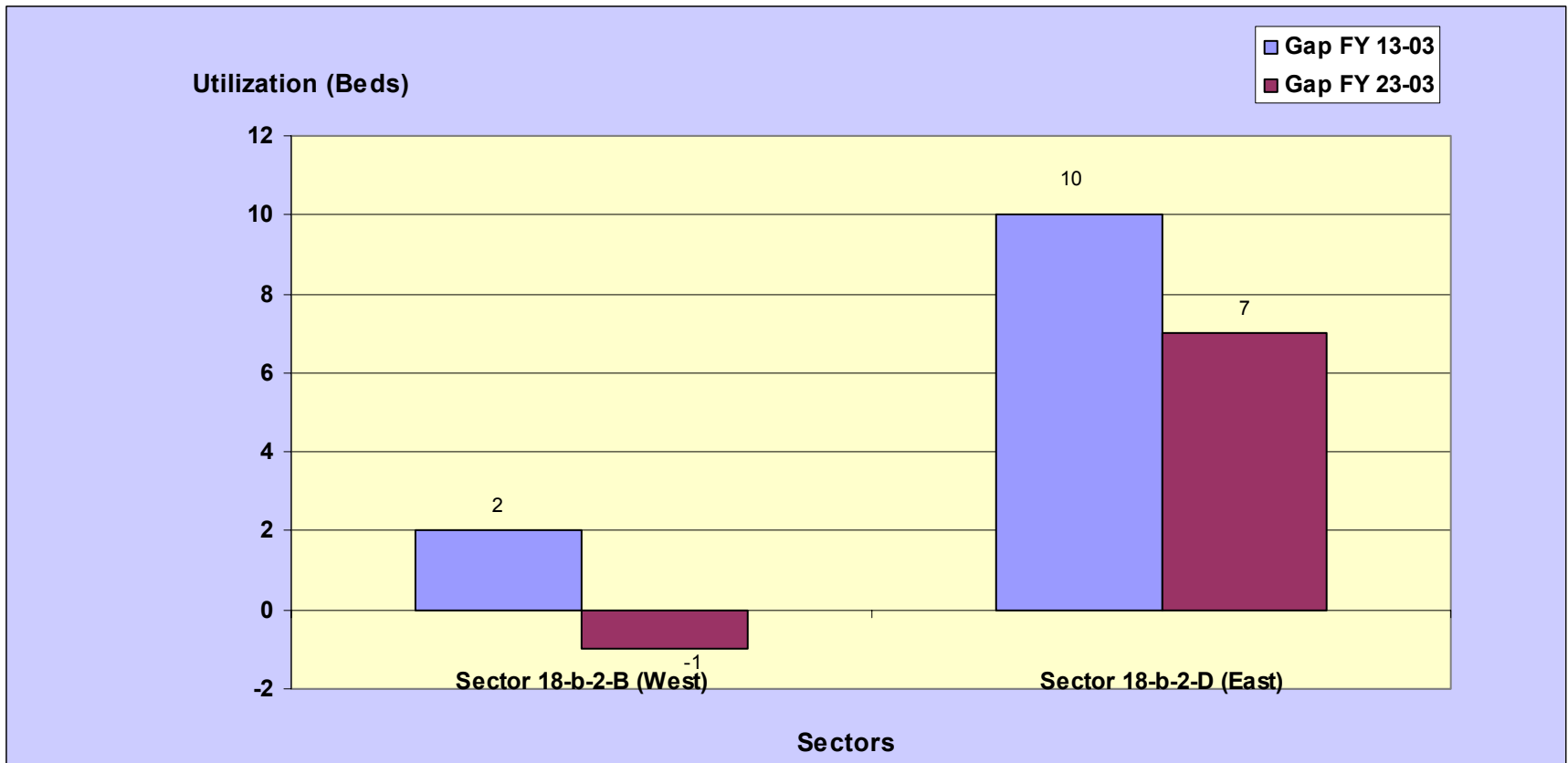
# Big Spring Facility Outpatient Projections

Utilization (Stops)



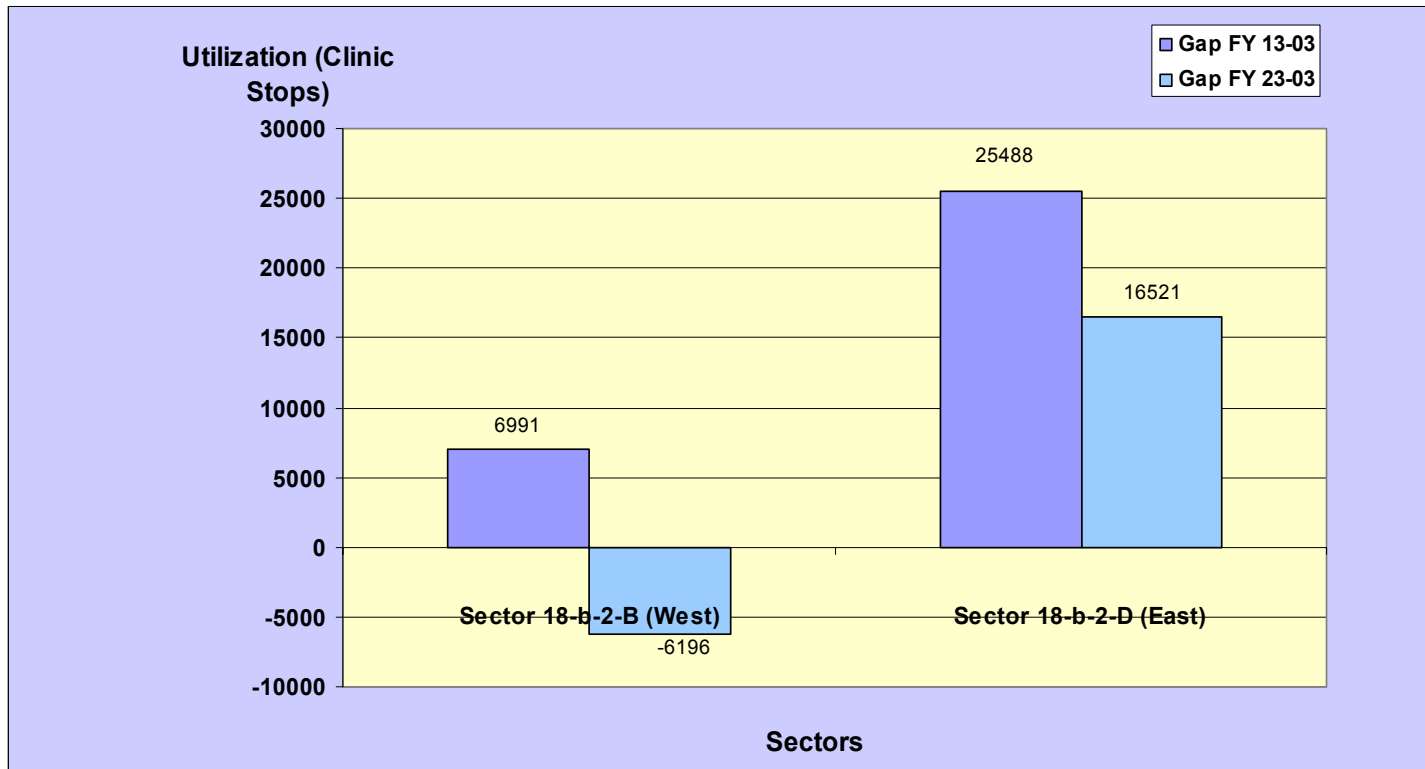

# What are the data telling us?

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- Opportunities:
  - There are some unmet market needs for inpatient care such as Domiciliary and Mental Health.
  - Unmet market needs also exist in outpatient areas such as Urology, Mental Health, and Orthopedics.

# What are the data telling us?

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- Challenges:

- Big Spring is projected to need fewer beds in its Internal Medicine and Surgery bed sections in the future.
- Big Spring is looking at a significant drop in its Primary Care workload with only modest increases or slight decreases for specialty care.
- The projected inpatient and outpatient workload is growing significantly faster in the East Sector than the West Sector.
