### 2004 Secretary's CARES Decision for Louisville

- The Secretary's CARES Decision Document for Louisville, Kentucky provides the following guidance for this study:
- VA will study the need for a replacement hospital for the Louisville VAMC
- The Louisville VAMC is in need of renovation
- There is an opportunity to partner with the University of Louisville
- There is also potential for collocation of a VBA presence at a new Louisville facility

### What's Being Studied at Louisville

#### Healthcare Study

Identify the best way to provide current and projected veterans with health care equal to or better than is currently provided in terms of access, quality, and cost effectiveness

#### Capital Planning Study

Identify the best use of buildings and facilities to provide needed healthcare services in a modern, safe and secure setting

#### Re-Use Study

Identify options that maximize the potential re-use of all or some of the current VA property, if that property is not needed for VA or VA-related services.

### Purpose of the LAP Meeting

- Review the options prepared by the contractor for the future use of this medical center.
- Present the options that the contractor believes will maintain or improve veterans' access to quality healthcare in a cost effective manner.
- Members of the LAP will ask questions so that each option is clear. Members of the public may also ask questions about the options.
- The LAP may add options not presented by the contractor.
- The LAP will recommend to the Secretary which options it believes should be studied further, but the Secretary is not required to adhere to this recommendation.


## **Louisville Public Input**

- 25 forms of stakeholder input were received between January 1, 2005 and June 30, 2005.
- The greatest amount of written and electronic input was received from veterans.
- Top key concerns:
  - Access to the facility
  - Use of the facility
  - Quality of healthcare services
- Some of the stakeholders wrote in favor of moving the facility to a downtown location near the University of Louisville.





#### **Louisville Site Overview**

#### ■ The Louisville VAMC:

- 117,000 enrolled Veterans reside in the Northern Market of VISN 9
- The Campus is composed of 1 main hospital and 15 out-buildings located on approximately 47 acres
- Is located on a hilltop near downtown Louisville, overlooking the Ohio River
- Employs about 1,100 Full Time Employee Equivalents
- Is affiliated with the University of Louisville

#### **Louisville Services Overview**

#### The Louisville VAMC:

- Offers:
  - Medicine and surgery
  - Psychiatry
  - Physical medicine and rehabilitation
  - Specialties such as neurology and oncology
  - Dentistry
  - Outpatient services
- Operates 114 beds
- Is a teaching hospital affiliated with the University of Louisville
- Operates Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs) in the Greater Louisville area, at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and New Albany, Indiana
- Contracts a significant amount of outpatient services

### **Current Status & Projections**

- Inpatient medicine and observation shows an upward trend between 2003 and 2013. This is followed by a decrease in demand between 2013 and 2023. The 2023 demand, however, remains higher than the 2003 levels. Projected demand for inpatient psychiatry and substance abuse shows an upward trend between 2003 and 2023.
- Buildings were constructed between 1947 and 1951.
- The main hospital building is well maintained but has significant fire and life safety issues related to the age of the building.
- There is no appreciable vacant space on the campus and parking is difficult.
- The laundry serves the Louisville and Lexington VAMCs.

### **Summary of Options for Louisville**


- A <u>Baseline</u> option accounting for projected volumes but no change to programs or services and renovating main hospital building over a twelve year period. (BPO 1)
- Two of the options are to construct a replacement hospital on the existing campus. (BPOs 2 and 3)
- Two of the options are to renovate the existing hospital and construct a new addition. (BPOs 4 and 5)
- Four of the options are for collocation and to construct a new hospital at the University of Louisville campus. (BPOs 6, 7, 8, and 9)
- Four of the options are for constructing a new hospital near the University of Louisville campus. (BPOs 10 11, 12, and 13)


### BPO 1: Baseline [HC-1/CP-1/RU-1]

A Baseline option reflects the:

Current state projected out to 2013 and 2023 without any changes to facilities or programs, but accounting for projected utilization changes, and assuming same or better quality, and necessary improvements for a safe, secure, and modern healthcare environment

Renovate the main hospital. Right-size services. Contract out services exceeding capacity. All other services and buildings will remain in their present location with maintenance and systems replacement per the CAI defined schedule. The VBA does not collocate to the campus. There are no land parcels for re-use.





## **BPO 1: Assessment, Baseline**

Healthcare Access	Access remains unchanged. Acute and tertiary care access drive time guidelines are met. Primary care access does not meet drive time guidelines.
Healthcare Quality	Major renovation fails to meet requirements of a modern, safe, secure environment and does not meet demand.
Impact on VA & Local Community	Enhanced facilities and technologies. Robust research programs and affiliation are retained.
Cost Effectiveness	Cost to renovate is significant and does not result in modern environment. Current layout has potentially negative effect on operating costs. Continued investment in maintenance is significant.
Ease of Implementation	Patient inconvenience and difficult staging. Additional patient care would be contracted during the 12 year renovation period.
Wider VA Program Support	No room for collocation with VBA.

## BPO 2: Replacement hospital at Zorn Ave with Veterans Benefit Administration (VBA) [HC-2A/CP-2A/RU-1]

Construct new hospital with modern facilities for research, outpatient care, women's care and advanced technology that meets 2023 demand projections. Construct new parking facilities with improved access for all veterans including handicapped individuals. Collocate with VBA.





## BPO 2: Assessment, Replacement hospital at Zorn Ave with Veterans Benefit Administration (VBA)

Construct new hospital with modern facilities for research, outpatient care, women's care and advanced technology that meets 2023 demand projections. Construct new parking facilities with improved access for all veterans including handicapped individuals.







Renovate building 1 (main hospital) for research, outpatient care, and support and administrative functions, and VBA. Construct new parking facilities with improved access for veterans and handicapped individuals. Collocate VBA in renovated building.

Construct new parking structure with direct connection to new hospital building. Construct separate CBOC for primary care. Collocate VBA in renovated building 1 space.










