What is the Enhanced-Use Leasing Program?

The EUL Program, more commonly called Reuse, refers to legislative authority that allows VA to:

- Lease underutilized land or buildings on VA medical campuses
- To a preferred developer who has been selected in an open competition
- through a long-term lease
- in exchange for cash, goods or in-kind services that support or benefit veterans

Goals of the Enhanced-Use Leasing Program

EUL Program looks to ensure that the Master Planning of any site considers reuse plans that:

- Enhance the Department's mission
- Are compatible with the fabric of existing neighborhoods;
- Maintain the historical, aesthetic and cultural values of the site; and
- Create adaptive reuse of existing buildings, wherever feasible

CARES and the Enhanced-Use Leasing Program


 CARES studied the healthcare needs at VA campus to configure an appropriately sized medical facility through renovation or new construction

 The results identified anticipated capital requirements and the potential reuse of existing buildings or underutilized land

St. Albans Enhanced-Use Leasing

- •To understand the reuse potential, an extensive real estate market assessment was done on the St. Albans campus that included three reports:
 - Real Property and Environmental Baseline
 - Reuse Initial Feasibility Assessment
 - Detailed Reuse Analysis
 - At the end of CARES study, and once the capital planning for new construction is complete, EUL process may begin

St. Albans Reuse Report

Site

- 25+ acres of contiguous land
- Good access to transportation
- Bounded by residential neighborhood

Market

- Queens is a very active market
- New development is primarily residential
- Very little undeveloped land available

St. Albans Reuse Report

- Continuing Care Retirement Community and Multifamily project may include:
 - Active senior living apartments, independent living, assisted living, Alzheimer's, skilled nursing units and hospice
 - Apartments may give veteran preference and/or discounted rents
- Retail/restaurants

Veterans Benefit Enhanced-Use Leasing Program

Revenues

 Revenues from the leasing of St. Albans property will go towards construction and delivery of veterans health care services

In-Kind Consideration

 Exchange of renovation or new construction for the medical facility and other complementary services

Complementary Uses

Medical offices, imaging centers and nearby retail/restaurants will support older veterans living in the neighborhood and their families
