This letter is in regards to our conversation that we had yesterday morning, concerning the above client.

Family Support Services has parenting classes on Tuesdays which consist of parenting skills, nurturing program, or whatever the parents request from their evaluation forms. On Thursdays we have a mother's group where our mothers get together and share different types of crafts, go on excursions, or may even have a speaker from another agency to come and speak to them about certain topics, that our mothers have requested.

This past curriculum was on nurturing and how important it is for us as parents to take care of ourselves so that we don't get over stressed with our everyday routines. Our curriculum began on April 28, 1992 and ended June 9, 1992. Throughout this period Jaylin attended all but one parenting class. She is always taking an active part in sharing some of her own personal experiences with the rest of the class or in helping problem solve with other people's concerns. In our mother's group she has only attended a couple of classes, due to her having other appointments.

In speaking with Mrs. Kema and hearing from [REDACTED] I understand that a hearing is soon to occur concerning the Acol/Kema family. As you know, I have been involved with the young parents since last summer, when I was contacted by Peter to help him and his wife in view of CPS intervention. Since that time, I have remained involved, although at times my contacts have been sporadic. In addition to difficulties that they have encountered in their roles as parents, both Peter and Jaylin have had to deal with tidal waves of crises and problems, some of them of their own making, some of them out of their control. Thus the last six months have continued to be filled with many obstacles for the young couple.

As things seemed to deteriorate more and more, linked, it seems, with the movement of [REDACTED] from East Hawaii to Kona, Jaylin and Peter failed to maintain regular contacts with me. Although I heard from Jaylin periodically by phone, keeping me apprised of what was going on in their lives, I did not see either of the Kemas for four months. In April, Jaylin rallied and began seeing me on a regular basis; we have had 6 visits since April 14th. Peter has been more sluggish, seeing me only once, on June 16th, although subsequent visits had to be cancelled due to his work schedule.

Peter's reaction to the negative chaos in his life is characteristic of his past patterns: he becomes depressed, angry, egocentered, and passively resistant. His sense of self-worth is, and has been, quite vulnerable. As he says it, "I have a hole in my life" reflecting the problems that he has experienced with his family of origin and with his own, immediate family. Faced with this emotional void, Peter's hurt is tremendous, he becomes morose and quick to feel hurt or angered, and he becomes bogged down in ineffectiveness. Of

course, all of the crises that have hit him and Jaylin (financial problems, Court cases and impending incarceration, problems finding work, the loss of an unborn child by miscarriage, continued conflicts with his family of origin, etc., etc., etc.) have not lessened his load; most of us would buckle under such bombardment. In any case, Peter wants very much to do the right thing and wishes that his family was reunited. He is aware and concerned about his ineffective lack of progress, but feels emotionally laden to the point of self-defeat. He still denies any known inappropriate physical maltreatment of Peter Jr. or of Jaylin's [REDACTED]. His response to current CPS intervention is to want to leave the family, to let Jaylin provide for the kids, and for himself to be absent. Part of his response stems from his sense of hurt and depression, sort of a "hurt puppy" attitude; part is perhaps to induce guilt in Jaylin; and part is based on sound, logical reasoning.

One promising development with Peter is his probationary status under John Sanchez at Adult Probation. Mr. Sanchez is a tough-minded but concerned probation officer who very much would like to see Peter progress towards his goals and is eager to participate in a network of monitored services. Perhaps, Mr. Sanchez's involvement with Peter will be able to provide some spark, some mandate to Peter's rather lethargic pattern.

In contrast with Peter's difficulties with follow-through, Jaylin has been striving valiantly and admirably to follow the service plan offered by CPS, to attend parenting classes, to take part in counseling, and to spontaneously attend ATV. She is currently going through the application process with State Employment for training, because she is tired of inactivity and wants to be involved and working. She is able to articulate her dilemma regarding her desire to maintain her relationship with Peter, countered by his inactivity regarding the service plan. Despite the strong discomfort that it puts her through, Jaylin states that she would put [REDACTED] first, in view of Peter's lack of involvement in gaining services. Of course, she would prefer to not have to chose between her husband and [REDACTED] feeling that with work they can all be together.

Jaylin's earlier responses to the negative happenings in her life was to be befuddled, hurt, angry, and rather highly

depressed. Now, she appears to be really moving out of that mode of coping and is assertively and actively progressing in a positive direction. She is going to Kona to see [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] she is attempting to create better communication with her family of origin, she is actively seeking help, she looks forward to further parenting classes; in other words, Jaylin seems to be doing well. She consistently has denied any direct knowledge of harmful physical behavior towards [REDACTED] by either herself or Peter. She acknowledges that Peter Jr. was hurt, but has no real understanding of the how's or the why's. I'm inclined to believe her. All she wants is to be able to be a mother again, ideally with Peter, but without him, if necessary.

Via the grapevine, I have heard that CPS may be recommending permanent placement for [REDACTED] with Jaylin [REDACTED] in Kona. Whereas I can understand the need for young children to have a sense of stability and permanency in their lives, I do believe that Jaylin is showing very good faith in the work that she is now doing to abide by the service plan in order to become reunited with [REDACTED]. Thus, unless her involvement in the service plan actually does not show the progress that she describes in counseling, I do not believe that removing her ability to be a mother to [REDACTED] will be in her best interests and probably not in the best interests of [REDACTED] either, in view of the increased estrangement that would very probably be created between Jaylin (and Peter) and [REDACTED]. In one respect, everyone would lose if Jaylin loses her ability to parent [REDACTED].

Of course, the real bug-a-boo is Peter and his angry, depressed lethargy. I would recommend that CPS and the Court look closely at returning [REDACTED] to Jaylin at some time in the near future, without Peter's presence, and with a clear-cut, monitored plan of services for him to follow before he could re-enter the family unit. Perhaps, Peter's connection with Adult Probation could intensify the plan of services and the monitoring thereof.

I realize that this case has been, and continues to be, a sticky one. Thank you for hanging in there; I guess we all have been, including Jaylin and even Peter, in his own way. Please contact me if questions arise or if you require further opinion.

Man sentenced for burglary

A 22-year-old Kona man has been sentenced to 21 days in jail and five years probation after pleading no contest to a second-degree burglary charge.

According to Third Circuit Court documents, Peter J. Kema broke into a building in the Kaloko subdivision in August 1990 with intent to commit theft.

The state dismissed a second-degree theft charge in exchange for Kema's no contest plea to burglary.

Kema was sentenced Feb. 24 by Judge Ronald Ibarra of Kona, who also ordered the defendant to pay about \$1,700 in restitution.

In another recent Third Circuit Court case, Dante Balsimo, 22, of Waimea, was sentenced Feb. 7 to five years probation for his role in a break-in at the Kamehameha Pharmacy in North Kohala.

Balsimo was also ordered to pay restitution, complete 100 hours of community service or pay a \$5,000 fine, submit to random drug and alcohol tests, and undergo substance abuse counseling. Balsimo had entered a no contest plea to a second-degree attempted burglary charge.

According to court documents, Balsimo and Scott C. Coll, 28, of Kapaau, used a glass cutter to break a window and enter the pharmacy on May 24, 1991. Coll received the same sentence from Ibarra on Jan. 6.

I understand that a hearing is soon to occur concerning the [REDACTED] Kema family. Last November I wrote to your agency concerning my contacts with Peter and Jaylin and emphasized my views about ways to deal with the young couple. Since the time of my last written documentation, Jaylin and Peter have continued to go through numerous crises and changes: Peter's dealings with the Judiciary, Jaylin's pregnancy and medical problems, continued friction with Jaylin's family, nonemployment and monetary problems, tenuous living conditions, etc.

Whereas in the past the young folks had maintained fairly regular contact with me, I have had minimal face-to-face contact with Jaylin and Peter since early November. I saw them on three occasions during November and early December. Then I was on the Mainland for three weeks. Following my return in early January, I have had no therapy contacts with either of them. We only saw each other at a joint meeting with attorneys and [REDACTED]. On a number of occasions, telephone contact was initiated by Jaylin with agreed upon appointments set, but those get-togethers never materialized. Jaylin and Peter were not at the appointed place at the appointed time, even on occasions when we had had telephone contact only a short time (i.e., hours) before.

I am not sure what the basis for their lack of follow through is. Perhaps it involves continued chaotic responses to chaotic stresses and demands; they perhaps respond to what is right in front of them and are unable to follow through on planned activities or commitments. Perhaps it involves ineffectual inexperience. Perhaps it involves passive resistance, based on a sense of victimization. No matter what its etiology, Jaylin's and Peter's lack of follow-through in

therapy and in other areas is definitiely self-defeating and forebodes little progress toward constructure personal growth or reunification.

At our last telephone contact a week ago, Jaylin informed me of her miscarriage and hospitalization. She noted that they had moved into a new apartment but had no phone. I stressed their need to exercise responsibility in getting in touch with me to set up a future appointment. But as of this date, I have not heard from either of the young people.

Despite the frustrating quality of working with Jaylin and Peter, I would like to remain available as a resource for them in the future. All of us need to continue to work together to find ways to help them deal with their depressive, chaotic lives and to find means of being more organized, planned, and purposeful.

Please contact me if questions arise or as new plans develop.
