- 6a. Yes, because the Program Office feels that a project of this magnitude requires a Project Manager with the discipline and initiative of someone who has a independently verifiable credential that a professional (graduate) degree would represent. It should Page 3

be noted that the person, in addition to a graduate degree must also have "relevant experience in managing a project of this level of complexity". Someone with only a Bachelor's degree and related experience alone would not be considered eligible for the position of Project Manager.

- 7) Please clarify whether it's allowable for contingent hires to be key personnel? Clarify section L.9.2, the distinction between new hire and contingent hires?
- 7a. It is allowable for a contingency hire to be a key personnel. Please see Section L.9 LETTERS OF COMMITMENT KEY PERSONNEL, for the distinction between new hire and contingent hires?
- 8) Please clarify which attachments mentioned in section J.1 are required and where should these be attached?
- 8a. Sections J.1, J.2, J.3, J.6 and J.7 are required. Sections J.1, J.2, J.3 and J.6 should be submitted in Part 3 of the proposal. J.7 should be submitted with the past performance information.
