Free Training Programs

<u>Announcement of Availability</u>: Airport Surface Safety Training Programs for Mechanics and Ramp Personnel

When a mechanic is towing an aircraft, that aircraft is considered a vehicle. If an incident occurs during the time a mechanic is towing the aircraft, it is counted as a vehicle/pedestrian deviation. Below are the Runway Safety Program statistics for FY-04 for the Southern Region. These statistics include 14 CFR part 139 airports as well as towered general aviation airports.

Total Number of Surface Incidents: 56 **Categorized as Incursions**: 12 out of the 56

Incursions Caused by mechanics towing aircraft: 5 out of the 12

As you can see, this last type of incursion accounts for almost half of the incursions recorded for Southern Region in FY-04.

The FAA introduced two new interactive CD-ROMs training programs for aircraft taxi procedures and tug and tow procedures. The training programs were created and produced by our Flight Standards Service Aircraft Maintenance Division and Office of Runway Safety organizations. These CD-ROMs are **free of charge** and the AC tells you how to obtain a copy.
