LANDS END UPDATE

Efforts are underway to enhance the Coastal Trail at Lands End. This project is part of *Trails Forever*, a park-wide initiative to establish a world-class trail system and protect park resources in the Golden Gate National Parks. Lands End improvements are made possible by the generosity of the Richard and Rhoda Goldman Foundation, the California Coastal Conservancy, other community partners, and the 12,103 members of the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- Improved visitor experience
- Trail improvements
- Enhanced visitor safety
- Habitat restoration
- Community stewardship

SCHEDULE

OCTOBER 14-15

- Turnpike and culvert construction to improve drainage and prevent erosion
- Installation of post and cable fencing
- Creation of brush piles for bird habitat
- Trail tread and staircase repair
- Removal of selected non-native plants and invasive shrubs and groundcover to increase natural diversity
