L. 97-446). Since review of this matter by the Committee will involve information the premature disclosure of which would be likely to significantly frustrate implementation of proposed action, the meeting from approximately 9:30 a.m. to approximately 3:00 p.m. will be closed pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552b(c)(9)(B) and 19 U.S.C. 2605(h). Seating is limited. Persons wishing to attend the open portion of the meeting on January 28, must notify cultural property staff at (202) 619-6612 no later than 5 p.m. (EST) Tuesday, January 26, 1999, to obtain security clearance for admission into the USIA building.
